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Dearest Sisters,

We have entered into the season of Advent – the New Liturgical year with lots of expectations and hopes for tomorrow. It's a time spent in eager waiting for the Lord to enter into our hearts, homes, communities and the world.

THE SPIRITUALITY OF ADVENT

Advent is the great liturgical season of waiting. The waiting that comes with Advent is fun because it's finite. We know what's coming at the end of our wait will be good, and we know exactly how many days we have left to wait for it. But much of the waiting that occupies us is open-ended. During this pandemic, ailing people wait for healing, children wait for an educational opportunity, students wait for the reopening of the school, poor people wait for economic support from all sides, young people wait for employment without knowing if it will come, the guilty wait for forgiveness and the voiceless wait for justice.

In the perspective of the theme of waiting, Bishop Robert Barron brings to light the spirituality of Advent alluding to the German Film **Run Lola Run** by Tom Tykwer. It is a tale of a young man, Manni who one day was doing a job for a crime boss. His job was just to deliver a bag of money to him with 1,00,000 DM (Deutsche Mark). Unfortunately, Manni leaves the bag on a train, which is picked up by a homeless man. This leaves Manni in quite a predicament. He is supposed to deliver the money to a gangster by noon, if he fails, then he is likely to be killed. Lola has twenty – minutes to save her boyfriend. Twenty short minutes to somehow find the money and get it to him. Lola is running and running trying to accomplish this goal. She slows to a trot then she looks up and she says, "I'm waiting, I'm waiting." There is no indication in the movie that she's the least bit religious. God is never mentioned once but there's no question that at that moment it's something like a prayer and then of course, oddly the whole plot resolves itself and she accomplished what she wants. It is as though the prayer was answered. Lola is an interesting Advent figure as she reflects the story of each one of us who run and run to achieve something in our lives and at the end, gape at the sky and say resolutely "I'm waiting."

In the Bible, God promises to Abraham: "You'll be the father of many nations" even though he and his wife were very old. For years nothing happened in the life of Abraham and Sarah after God made His promise. Both of them grew older. Probably people around him would have discouraged them to disbelieve the Promise of God. But Abraham waits with trust for the Lord to have His way.

In our lives too, we need to put ourselves on God's timetable and not our own. Very often in our spiritual life, we do not allow God to accomplish what He wants to do in our lives. God

has promised something to us but we're not ready for it yet as we have to go through a kind of long period of training and discipline to acquire a skill.

While speaking about prayer, Saint Augustine says that God sometimes delays in answering prayer, because in the process of waiting, He wants the heart to expand in prayer, to receive the greater good what He wants to give. So we ask for something and we expect it but the heart is not prepared yet. The heart isn't big enough to receive what God wants to give and so God makes us wait. As we wait, the heart gets bigger, more receptive so that when God is ready on his timetable to give us what He wants, then we're finally ready to receive the greater good what God wants to share with us.

Advent is a significant time to wait for the Lord to act. It is a time to enter into the framework of God. It is time to submit ourselves to the timetable of the divine. Advent is a lovely time to enter into space, God has prepared for us. In our life, there are many moments where we wait, wait in a doctor's office, wait in a shop, wait in a bus stand, railway station. We hate waiting. But do we realize that it is a God-given space to enter into the sanctuary of our soul to speak with our Lord and listen to Him? Do we realize that it is a God-given time to intermediate His grace and blessings for humankind through prayer? This can be one way of waiting for the Lord and spiritually to welcome Him with a prepared heart to receive Him. It is also an opportunity to receive Jesus who comes to encounter us through the Eucharist, at Christmas and His Second coming.

May our Blessed Mother Mary bring Jesus to the World as a Savior and Healer. May the year 2021 dawn with new dreams and new hope.

FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION AND BIRTHDAY OF THE **ORATORY:** "Everything began with a Hail Mary. From when Don Bosco met Bartholomew Garelli on December 8, 1841, the Feast of the Immaculate became the Birthday of the Oratory for the entire Salesian World. Tuesday, December 8 at noon, the Salesian houses all over the world will join together in a circle and will pray to the Madonna to recall the fruitful 'seed' of Don Bosco's Work on that distant day of 1841. The Immaculate dominates the oratory experience. Some providential coincidences led Don Bosco to attribute to Her a special intercession at the beginning of his work. "All of our great initiatives began on the day of the Immaculate," he would state (BM XVII). The paradigm was oratory. Don Bosco made the Immaculate a lively presence among the boys of Turin, and Mary Mazzarello did this among the girls of Mornese. Mary is felt by the educators and the young as a living, motherly, and powerful presence who gives them security and hope. Mary Immaculate, as the ideal of purity, exerts an attraction among the young. She helps them to grow as human beings and in the faith, to be strong and not give in to the temptation of being superficial Christian men and women, but to live responsibly and to always seek more and more what is above. May Mary our Immaculate Mother accompany us on our journey and may our Founders keep alive in us the enthusiasm of the "da mihi animas cetera tolle". Let's continue to pray together and present to Our Lady the sufferings and hopes of the entire humanity.
