Dearest Sisters,

Viva Gesu`!

Greetings of joy to each of us as we recall with gratitude the gratuitous gift of God's call to each one of us on 24 May 2022. God says, "I will betroth you to me forever: I will betroth you to me in righteousness and in justice in steadfast love and in mercy." (Hosea 2:19)

Don Bosco wanted us to be "a living monument of gratitude to Mary" and Mother Mazzarello, cornerstone of this monument affirms that we are "true images of Mary." We are a living monument of gratitude to Mary insofar as we *reproduce in ourselves her image*. Reflecting on the life of Mary, it is easy for us to realize that Mary may also be defined as a living monument of gratitude, a perennial "thank you" raised to God. We, therefore, must be a living monument of gratitude to her who is a living monument of gratitude to God

We are not a penitential *monument*, but *one of gratitude*. Even in this, we have a perfect model in Mary, who with her song of the *Magnificat*, has raised a monument of perennial gratitude to God, associating to herself all of redeemed humanity, especially the humble and the poor. As women who remember, let us humbly *enter into our history to discover the great things which the Lord has done for us*. Marvels are not missing from our lives: sometimes we simply forget to marvel at them. Gratitude is the timid and humble wealth of the person who knows she has nothing. Gratitude then blossoms into the joyous announcement of a Gospel experience as such, the good news. *Only thus can we announce the Gospel with our lives and announce it singing, sowing hope*.

The monument of gratitude that Mary raised to God was not made of stone but **life and works**. She who remembers the marvels and who gives thanks naturally seeks to strive diligently to see that they are **prolonged**. The woman of memory, the Virgin of the Magnificat is also a helper. To be a living **monument of gratitude consists precisely in involving others above all the young**, to share with us a common memory in singing the song of the Magnificat in such a way that the Word of God, His salvific will, is realized in all. It is in this way that we become 'helpers' capable of responding to the deep expectations of the young, like Mary and with Mary.

The foundation of the monument is sanctity. Our lady is calling us to sanctity. She wants us to live up to the charity of the 'one body and one soul' in our prayers, community life and the collaboration of our daily work which is a powerful means of our sanctification. The monument of gratitude that we have to build, will foster among us in the first place, a family atmosphere, individual and collective serenity and confidence and trust. It will

make each of our houses "the house of God's love" as we earnestly desire. Gratitude is in word, action and amiability. It expresses the love of God and neighbour, generous dedication which is self-sacrificing, and cheerfulness in hope and expectation. It is love according to God, like Our Lady's and so it is an active love, a source of happiness, of interior and exterior joy and peace.

#### WITHIN THE FAMILY:

**R.I.P.:**On 23 April 2022, Sr. Arokiasami Philomena, winged her flight to Heaven to join the choirs of angels to sing the unending song of gratitude to God her creator and divine spouse. Sr. Philo's flight to heaven was indeed a home going that was so silent and least expected. Except for the past three days, she participated in the online Mass and received Holy Communion and spent some time in the chapel. On 22 April as her food intake was on the decrease, her health began deteriorating. So, Fr. Francis Sagaya Pinto SDB from Mary Help of Christians Shrine – Broadway was called. He blessed and gave her communion. On 23 April 2022, Sisters observed that her pulse was going down and she was breathing hard. Immediately, Dr.Arumugam from Twenty Four Hour Hospital, Broadway was called to assist her. She serenely went to heaven at 11.15 a.m. on 23 April 2022 to receive the reward of a good and faithful servant in the presence of Sr. Fernando Majella the Animator, Sr. Gomez Dorathy one of her past animators of Broadway, and sisters of the community.

Sr. Philomena, born in Pakala on 24 March 1933 was a long, rich and fruitful eighty-nine years of life and sixty - one years as a religious. She grew up in her family with five brothers and four sisters. In this cradle of love and solid values, she grew up to groom herself to be an energetic and passionate young lady able to give herself for the education of others as a teacher for three years – one year in St. Ann's Convent - Chennai and two years in Tirupattur - Mary Immaculate Convent before she joined our congregation.

She desired to become a nun as an expression of her ardent love for Jesus and zeal for the salvation of souls. She was compassionate towards the poor and the sick. She was fascinated by the beauty of nature and loved to dress with vanity and modernity. She was pious, fond of participating in the Mass, listening to sermons and taking part in processions. In the family, she loved to take part in the pilgrimages, marriages, birthday parties and family get-togethers. She enjoyed her school days, jumped, played, went for excursions etc. When she became a teacher, she exhibited her passion for teaching with artistic skill, and the ability to write beautifully and capture the attention of the students using the demonstrative method.

She joined the Aspirantate on 15 April 1958 and made her first profession on **5 August 1961**. When she was in the Aspirantate, she was frightened to see some aspirants being sent back home. But nothing stopped her from being herself. Sr. Philo always tried to be a coherent person. She was cheerful and happy always. She recalls that she had some struggles in the formation house. In the Novitiate, her Mother's Mistress tried to mould her in various ways. She always showed herself to be pliable to corrections. The observations given by the formators did not deter her from relating with them. She affirms that Sr. Consiglia Tarricone and Sr. Rita Thomas guided her in following religious life in the Salesian way.

In her tenure of sixty-one years of religious life, Sr. Philomena has rendered her dedicated service in the Province and the then undivided Province of Chennai mostly as a teacher, a headmistress, an assistant of the boarders, an economer, ardent collaborator in parish ministry teaching of catechism, guiding the couples to rectify their marriage, preparation of adults for baptism and other sacraments, a zealous sister visiting the families, refugees, teaching the children in the Evening Study Centres, exponent of culinary art in the kitchen, maintenance

of garden etc. in the communities of Auxilium - Katpadi, Tirupattur - Mary Immaculate, Vellore - St. Mary's, Chennai - Tiruvottiyur, Vyasarpadi, Kingsford, Broadway, Arni, Pallikonda, Guntur - Auxilium, Tiruchirapalli - VadakkuPaganoor, Madurai - Sirudur, Coimbatore and Polur. From 2003 – 2005 she was helping in the kitchen, as an assistant, responsible for visiting the families at Asirvathapuram in Chennai, Broadway. From 2005 onwards till the last day, she continued to be in Chennai - Broadway engaged in prayer ministry.

She was tender-hearted towards the poorest of the poor, attentive to the needs of the sick and the ageing. She cherished with joy her good works done for the refugees of Srilanka camped in Arni. The refugees fondly called her "queen of refugees". When she was transferred, many refugees wept and beckoned her to come back to work among them. In obedience, she bowed her head to God's will and offered her services with joy and dedication in the spirit of Da mihi animas.

Dearest sisters, it is so significant that we pay our last homage to our dear Sr. Philomena on the feast of Divine Mercy. Once Jesus said to St. Faustina: "My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed: a great struggle for my kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone." Intercede for us to dearest Sr. Philo, get many young girls to follow Jesus more closely and build His kingdom on earth with passion. Rest in peace in the merciful heart of Jesus.

**NEW SAINTS TO THE CHURCH, AND TAMIL NADU:** DevasahayammPillai from Kanyakumari district in Tamil Nadu, the first Indian layman to be declared a saint by the Vatican on **May 15, 2022**. He took the name 'Lazarus' in 1745, was first approved for sainthood in February 2020, is known for "enduring increasing hardships" after embracing Christianity and was killed in 1752. The Tamil Nadu Bishop's Conference - TNBC will organize a National level **Thanksgiving Day** on 5 June 2022, to praise and thank the Lord for the great gift to the Church and to Tamil Nadu. May his holiness spur all of us to increase sanctity in the church.

Blessed Artémides Zatti, an Italian, a noted pharmacist, emigrated to Argentina in 1897, became a professed Salesian in 1911, is known for his ardent faith and commitment to the sick. Artémides first worked in a hotel and in a brick factory. After meeting Fr Carlos Cavalli, he decided to join the Salesians of Don Bosco. He recovered from TB after turning to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On 5 March 1903 he became a manager of the pharmacy in the hospital of San José. His routine included morning Mass and meditation as well as a bike ride to the sick. He would visit patients and entertain them with games. After work he read spiritual texts and studied, eventually gaining a nursing diploma. A much-loved person, Artémides became ill and eventually died of cancer on 15 March 1951 in Videma. The miraculour healing of a man with ischemic stroke from Philipines paved way for his canonization. The date of the canonization will be decided by the supreme Pontiff in the course of an ordinary consistory. May the life of Blessed Artémides Zatti increase holiness in Salesian Family.

SAFEGUARDING MOTHER EARTH: On 12 March 2022, responding to one of the priority choices of the XXIV General Chapter, the eleven Institutions of Higher Studies of Asia and Africa participated in an online International Seminar on "The Role of Young People in Safeguarding Mother Earth", organized by the Auxilium College of Education of Regunathapuram, of the FMA of Blessed Eusebia Palomino Community. A total of 500 people were enrolled in the Seminar, of whom 192 were students, as well as professors and FMA connected through a multimedia platform, and others through YouTube. Sr. IvoneGoulart Lopes, Collaborator of the FMA Institute Youth Ministry Sector

and Referent for the ISS-FMA, and Sr. Regina Mary, member of the ISS-FMA Asia coordination group were present for the meeting. Fr. John Kennedy SJ, Director of JCERT held the conference, inviting young people to be authentic guardians of the Planet Earth. Fr. John gave about twenty young people the space to share their innovative ideas and an action plan to protect the common home, encouraging other students to take care of the Earth. The meeting concluded with gratitude for what had been learned, the commitment to gestures of concrete action, and the certainty that it is important to network with the Salesian Family, Institutions, and other educational bodies to move from words to deeds. Only together can we prepare the future and give hope to the younger generations by taking care of integral and, in particular, socio-political formation, according to the Social Doctrine of the Church. Thanks to Sr. Ayudukayam Arockia Malarjothi and others who organised the event.
