Dearest Sisters!

Joy wells up from our hearts as we think of our **first commitment** to the Lord and the **foundation day of our Institute** on **August 5**. The cause of our joy as we commemorate this day is our ardent desire to know, love, serve and be with him for all eternity in paradise. The month of August redoubles our joy as we recall Mary as the patron of our Nation which celebrates its **75 Independence day**. John Paul II said that the **Assumption** truly was an event of love, in which Mary's ardent longing to be with her son was finally fulfilled. In contemplating Mary in celestial glory we comprehend that she gracefully accepted varied experiences of *letting go* in her life.

# THE JOY OF LETTING GO

Being the daughter of Mary Help of Christians, Mary Mazzarello understood that to enjoy the bliss of Paradise in her life, she needed to embrace a string of experiences of letting qo. Let us have a glimpse of the incidents in the life of St. Mary Mazzarello where the complete detachment was demanded in a variety of ways, which also evokes a creative response from each one of us today. Mother Mazzarello before her illness was the right hand of her father and mother in her family. When typhoid was spreading virulently in her village, at the request of her spiritual director, she renders her dauntless service. As Maria's sewing class became established, she and her companions adapted to live as a community. Owing to this commitment, they were not always available for parish meetings or traditional apostolates of the group. To avoid the scandal a split might cause, Fr. Pestarino banished Maria to Valpanasca, only allowing her to come to the village for Mass and the Sunday gatherings with the girls. Maria obeyed but this must have meant a particularly difficult letting go for her. After about a month, Maria was called back to the village to help prepare for the arrival of the great Don Bosco and his lively band of boys who were coming to Mornese during one of their famous Autumn Walks. It was not only Maria who was glad to be back to her work, the girls and their mothers were delighted to see her too

The transfer of the motherhouse from Mornese to Nizza was another painful moment of *letting go*. Up to this time, Maria had always lived in her native Mornese. She had seen it grow from dream to reality, from a tiny seed to a congregation, which had already spread outside her native Italy to France and even to far off South America. Through the transfer of the motherhouse, she was asked to part from the house of her dreams, the house of her life's work, sell the property to pay the debts of the growing Congregation. Her letters of this time give us a glimpse of her feelings as she said in one of her letters,

"We must always make sacrifices while we are on this earth.

Let us make them willingly and cheerfully and

the Lord will take note of everything and in his own time will give us a beautiful reward."

As her life drew to a close, she showed remarkable realism in looking at her role. She even tried to convince others that someone else could fulfil it better than she could by then and that replacing her then would actually avoid confusion at her death.

Another area which called for continual *letting go* especially in her later years were the constant goodbyes, both to those who left for faraway places where she would never see them again and the many who died. For Maria, these people were not lost but could be met and spoken to: in the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and Holy communion was a time of meeting not only with Jesus but also with all those we love, both living and dead. In this time of Pandemic, we too have lost our dear ones. They are not lost to us. We too can meet them and continue to support them and be helped by the in the heart of the Risen Jesus in whom neither time nor space matters.

Another very painful form of *letting go* was caused by some of her first companions who chose to leave the congregation and no longer walk the path of Salesian religious life with her. With a heavy heart she states "If we were to continue like this, the poor house of Mary would be deserted in a few years" Much of the *letting go* that we see in Maria's life, as in our own came as a response to circumstances, many of which were beyond her control. It was how she responded to situations that shows her spiritual strength. Both her human and her spiritual outlook on life helped her in this.

The three qualities that helped Mother Mazzarello to let go were her capacity to listen and accept the opinions of others, her sense of realism and her strong and courageous faith. So in a way, what she might be saying to us today is that *letting go* has to be easier if we truly believe as she did, that nothing or no one is ever really lost to us, provided we are close to God. We can meet all our dear ones in the Heart of Jesus. We will all be united once more in his kingdom and all we have given up for God's sake is in safekeeping. In this journey Mary follows our steps, she comforts us in the hour of darkness, reassures us with her maternal hand. Sustained by this awareness, let us continue with trust on our pathway of religious commitment where Providence leads us. Let us, under Mary's guidance, go forward in our lives.

Let us pay heed to the voice of our Mother General who in her circular 1011 exhorts us to make an appointment in prayer and communion, to celebrate August 5, renewing our gratitude for being a religious family desired by Mary and which belongs entirely to her. The feast of Our Lady of Snow is also an occasion to praise and thank God for his providential care in our Province and each one of us. Let us also remember to entrust the entire Province to Mary as we make an act of entrustment on 5 August 2021.
