The life Captivated in love

Blessed Maria Romero Meneses was a modern-day social reformer who brought about a "revolution of charity" in Costa Rica. She was born in Nicaragua in 1902, one of eight children who grew up in an upper-class family. Maria received a very good education at a school staffed by the Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians.

When she was 12 years old, Maria fell sick with rheumatic fever and struggled throughout the year to regain her health. She was completely paralyzed for six months but was patient and prayerful in her suffering, which she saw as a gift from God. Doctors reported that her heart was damaged from the sickness, but she appealed to Our Lady, Help of Christians, and received some sort of assurance that she would be healed. When a friend from the school visited her, she said, "I know that the Blessed Virgin will cure me." A few days later, she regained her health and returned to school, fully recovered.

A spiritual director helped her to understand better the mystical experiences she was having, and she realized that she was being called to religious life. Maria began to understand her purpose in life – to encourage social development by helping wealthy people see how they could change the lives of poor people. She gathered resources and established recreational centres and food distribution organizations. In 1961, she opened a school for poor girls; a few years later, a clinic and supported it by recruiting doctors and finding donations for medicine.

She had a vision to build a village for poor people that contained all they needed to flourish. In 1973, the first seven homes were built in a new development outside of the city named Centro San Josè—it grew to include a farm, a market, and a school where people could learn the faith and find job training. It also included a church dedicated to Our Lady, Help of Christians.

Blessed Maria Romero Meneses would say; "All of myself for all peoples". We can trace ten salient aspects about Blessed Maria Romero:

- 1. She was one of the Patron Saints of World Youth Day Panama 2019
- 2. The love of Sister Maria Romero for Jesus and Mary Help of Christians was so deep that she called them "My King" and "My Queen"
- 3. She loved the Church and she gave herself totally with the firm conviction that the Church has a mission that will mark history.

- 4. Sr. Maria had a profound ecological sense. She loved all of creation and one could say that her ecological habits were ahead of her times.
- 5. She also loved life and the family. That's why she tried to care and promote vocations to marriage and ensure that each member of the families is cared for.
- 6. Through music and artistic expression, Sister Maria found a way to connect with God and to respond to his love.
- 7. She was an active woman, but she also found the flame of love in prayer and contemplation to carry out her mission.
- 8. Sister Maria deeply loved her vocation as a consecrated Daughter of Mary Help of Christians which she discovered as a girl.
- 9. Although she was a Nicaraguan woman, she worked in Costa Rica for forty six years.
- 10. She loved multiculturalism valuing the universal richness of the church.

Maria knew that she was participating in God's work, so she had every confidence that her efforts at social development would grow.

She wrote in her journal on the 50 anniversary of her religious profession when she was seventy-five. "How happy exchange! In place of my father, you have given me yourself. In place of my mother, the Blessed Mother. In place of my brothers and sisters, the saints. In place of my friends, the angels. In place of my country, the whole world and after that heaven. In place of my will, your will. In place of my conflicts, rest and peace in your heart. In place of material riches, spiritual riches. In place of my earthly satisfactions, spiritual delights. In place of the cross, I have encountered you to live and die with you, to praise you eternally."

Two years later, when she was on a vacation in her homeland, Nicaragua, she looked out at the ocean and said, "I see God in every drop of water in the sea. How beautiful it would be to die facing the ocean. A couple of hours later, God answered her prayer. She suffered from a fatal heart attack and died on 7 July 1977. She is buried in the chapel in San Josè. St. John Paul II beatified Sr. Maria Romero on April 14, 2002. She is the first "Blessed" from Central America. May we also learn the lesson of the great exchange, that when we give everything to God, we receive more, much more than we could imagine. It may not be near the ocean today, where you like Sr. Maria could see God in every drop of water, I pray that you may find Him in every moment of your day.

Within The Family:

Thomas. Like St. Thomas the Apostle: Very often St. Thomas is referred as doubting Thomas. Like St. Thomas quiet often we too doubt the presence of God in our lives. But each time we believe after a doubt our bond with God is renewed and strengthened. Emeritus Pope Benedict XVI states that The Apostle Thomas' case is important to us for at least three reasons. Firstly it comforts us in our insecurity. Secondly it shows us that every doubt can lead to an outcome brighter than any uncertainty. Once he believed "He overtook the other Disciples". He brought Jesus to India. Thirdly he brought faith to us. The words that Jesus addressed to him remind us of the true meaning of mature faith. Pope Francis says: He believed not only in the resurrection but in God's boundless love as well. When Thomas's wounded humanity enters into Jesus' wounds, he rises from the dead. The Pope further states: "when God becomes my God... we begin to accept ourselves and to love life as it is".

On this significant day, we invoke the blessings of God the Almighty and St. Thomas on the FMA and SDB Provinces of Chennai who celebrate the feast of the Province. Through the

powerful intercession of the apostle, we pray that you be filled with the gifts of the spirit to proclaim the good news and recognize the visit of our Lord every day.
