ON THE PATH OF SYNODALITY

We are living in a historical period, where our institute is celebrating with gratitude and joy General Chapter XXIV with the theme "Do whatever He tells you" (Jn 2:5). Communities that generate life in the heart of contemporaneity" with the objective of re-awakening the original freshness of the Vocational fruitfulness of the FMA Institute. On the other hand amidst the global pandemic, local and international conflicts, the growing impact of climate change, migration, various forms of injustice, racism, violence, persecution, and increasing inequalities across humanity, suffering experienced by minors and vulnerable people due to sexual abuse, the abuse of power, and abuse of conscience, Pope Francis has announced a synod on the theme **For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission.**

DATE: The synodal path will begin at the Vatican, in the presence of the Pope, on 9 and 10 October 2021 with a time for encounter and reflection, followed by a moment of prayer and the celebration of the Eucharist. It will have three phases (Diocesan, Continental, Universal) of consultations and discernment, culminating with the assembly in October 2021 in Rome.

THE THEME - FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION AND MISSION:

COMMUNION: By His gracious will, God gathers us together as diverse peoples of one faith, through the covenant that he offers to his people. The communion we share finds its deepest roots in the love and unity of the Trinity. It is Christ who reconciles us to the Father and unites us with each other in the Holy Spirit. Together, we are inspired by listening to the Word of God, through the living tradition of the Church, and grounded in the 'sensus fidei' that we share. We all have a role to play in discerning and living out God's call for his people.

PARTICIPATION: A call for the involvement of all who belong to the People of God – laity, consecrated and ordained – to engage in the exercise of deep and respectful listening to one another. This listening creates space for us to hear the Holy Spirit together

and guides our aspirations for the Church of the Third Millennium. Participation is based on the fact that all the faithful are qualified and are called to serve one another through the gifts they have each received from the Holy Spirit. In a synodal Church the whole community, in the free and rich diversity of its members, is called together to pray, listen, analyse, dialogue, discern and offer advice on making pastoral decisions that correspond as closely as possible to God's will genuine efforts must be made to ensure the inclusion of those at the margins or who feel excluded.

MISSION: The Church exists to evangelize. We can never be centred on ourselves. Our mission is to witness the love of God in the midst of the whole human family. This Synodal Process has a deep missionary dimension to it. It is intended to enable the Church to better witness to the Gospel, especially with those who live on the spiritual, social, economic, political, geographical, and existential peripheries of our world. In this way, synodality is a path by which the Church can more fruitfully fulfil its mission of evangelization in the world, as a leaven at the service of the coming of God's kingdom.

THE OBJECTIVE: The objective of the current Synod is to listen, as the entire People of God, to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. We do so by listening together to the Word of God in Scripture and the living tradition of the Church, and then by listening to one another, and especially to those at the margins, discerning the signs of the times. The whole Synodal Process aims at fostering a lived experience of discernment, participation, and co-responsibility, where diversity of gifts is brought together for the Church's mission in the world.

THE PURPOSE: The purpose of this Synod is not to produce more documents. Rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission. The objective of this Synodal Process is a journey of growing authentically towards the communion and mission that God calls the Church to live out in the third millennium.

THE SYNODAL PROCESS: Discernment through listening to the Holy Spirit, Accessibility to ensure as many people as possible to participate, Cultural awareness to celebrate and embrace the diversity within local communities, the inclusion of those who feel excluded or marginalized, partnership, Respect for the rights, dignity, and opinion of each participant, Accurate syntheses that truly captures the range of critical and appreciative perspectives of all responses, including views that are expressed only by a minority of participants, Transparency and fairness. The entire month of October is dedicated to the Mother of God under the advocation of our Lady of Rosary, celebrated by the Church on the 7th. Let us rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary in our convents and in the families invoking our blessed mother to accompany us on the path of synodality in our communities, parishes, province, and in our institute.

WITHIN THE FAMILY:

MORNESE EXPERIENCE OF THE NOVICES: All the Novices of INT and INM Provinces took part in Online "Project Mornese" in Zoom meeting. Novices from English speaking countries participated in the meeting. The theme of the event was "Today Mother writes a letter for you". The meet started at 12pm. The introductory talk was given by our

Mother General Rev. Sr.Yvonne Reungoat. Sr.Rebosso Maria Nieves, General Councilor of Formation emphasized on the spirituality of Mother Mazzarello centered on the Eucharist and she insisted the Novices to meet Mother Mazzarello every 13th of the month by reading and writing a letter to her. Sr. Jeaette Palasota and Sr. Sahaya Sangitha Rani were the resource persons. The procedure of the programme began, as each Novitiate presented a three minutes video on their daily life activities. The INT and INM Novices of Diviyadhanam, creatively shared their formative activity in the Novitiate. A deep reflection on the three letters [18, 60, 67] of Mother Mazzarello to the Novices were explained in detail. The spirituality of Mother Mazzarello in the places where she lived was also delivered interestingly.

MEDIA COORDINATORS MEET: The Local Media Coordinators meet was held on 11th September from 03.30 pm. Sr. Antony Rayappan Jothy led the Media Coordinators into a general discussion on how to form action plans that are relevant during this COVID 19 period to inculcate better learning in the field of media in our communities. She spoke on how each Sister can be a resource person to help and teach others through online demo classes with regard to photos, mobile apps, editing in photos, videos and basic programs of Microsoft Office. The participants pledged to offer Media Education to Sisters, Staff, and all recipients.

VIRTUAL MEET OF THE ACADEMIC SECTOR: On 25th September, from 05.00 pm to 07.00 pm, all the sisters of the Province and teaching faculty from our schools and colleges participated in a virtual meet on the theme, "Role of Educators during and after Pandemic" by Dr. Jonas Richard, Professor and Head, Department of Social Work, Director, Center for life skills Education (CLSE), Kristu Jayanti College, Banglore. Thanks to Sr. Feranando Majella, the Academic Coordinator, for organising the above online meet. The resource person helped the sisters and the staff to reform themselves as quality Educators in this present outset of the Pandemic.

CATECHETICAL SEMINAR FOR TEACHERS: On 27th September Sr. Arokiam Gracy Rani, the Catechetical coordinator of the Province presented the New Catechism text books published by TNBCLC, Dindivanam, for the 77 teachers at Arch Bishop Louis Mathias Home, Tiruvottiyur, Chennai. Simple, intelligible and creative methods used in the text books paved a way for easy teaching and a joyful learning. The teachers took part actively and were motivated to use these text books as a means to trigger in our children a holy desire to know and love Jesus and to help them to grow unto the fullness of Christ.
