"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." - (John 14:27)

I send across to you, my sincere and prayerful wishes for a Happy and Hope-filled Easter.

• **DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY (07 April):** Divine Mercy Sunday is a special feast, celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. It was established by Pope John Paul II in 2000, based on the private revelations of Saint Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun. The feast focuses on the mercy of God, particularly emphasized in the message given to Saint Faustina, which centers on trust in Jesus and seeking His mercy for the whole world. The devotion to Divine Mercy has gained widespread popularity, offering hope and comfort to many in their spiritual journeys. As we ponder Christ's sacrifice and resurrection, we're called to pray: "Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy on us and the

world." This prayer sums up Divine Mercy, urging us to trust in love's transformative power and to share that mercy with everyone.

- FEAST OF ANNUNCIATION OF MARY (08 April): The Solemnity of the Annunciation, usually celebrated on 25 March each year, has been this year rescheduled to 08 April 2024, due to the Holy Week programme. Celebrating this significant day, we remember that event when God chose to begin the definitive realization of God's eternal plan of salvation of humankind, through the "Yes" of the humble handmaid of the Lord, Mary. The historical event of the Angel Gabriel appearing to the Blessed Virgin Mary reminds us of Mary's loving acceptance of God's divine plan. We honour her docility, obedience, humility, and her crucial role as the Mother of God. We earnestly beseech our Blessed Mother to intercede for us, that we may imitate her "Yes" to the will of our Heavenly Father, enabling us to bring forth her Divine Son in our souls, thereby manifesting Christ in the world through our lives.
- INT SDB IX PROVINCIAL CHAPTER: We extend our heartfelt wishes to Fr.
