My dear Sisters,

Tiruchirapalli - India

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes from Tiruchirappalli.

I am pleased to share with you the loving and prayerful wishes of our Mother General. I had the joy of meeting her during my annual retreat in Thailand and shared the journey of our Province. The encounter between the Mother and the Provincials was a significant moment and a precious gift for all of us. The availability of our loving Madre, along with the experiences shared by the Provincials and the hospitality of the hosting Province, made us feel extremely happy and immensely grateful to the Lord for the great family Spirit that we share in the Institute.

Dear Sisters, as we begin the month of November, we are called to remember the Saints and the Holy Souls. The Church invites us to pray for all the faithful who have gone before us, in the hope of their eternal reward. It is our bounden duty to pray for the faithful departed, especially for the souls in purgatory, who are most in need of God's divine mercy.

For the formative moment I wish to share with you an important element of our Charism: the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrament of God's loving presence in our midst.

The Eucharist is the Testament of Jesus:

The Institution of the Eucharist cannot be seen as an isolated episode in the life of Jesus. It is in fact a testament that holds great significance. It is the summation of the whole life and the mysteries that Jesus had lived during his short time on earth.

A testament has usually three implications: a) a synthesis of life; a culmination of one's own existence and a realization of a global vision; b) an interpretation of the eminent end giving sense to one's own life and mission, including death; c) a desire to extend the experience of the life lived beyond death, expressed through the gift of a value or word which makes the dying person present among his or her loved ones.

The words and gestures of Jesus at the Last Supper are a recapitulation of His entire life on earth. At the same time, the Last Supper was the interpretation and the anticipation of Jesus' death. Jesus already saw His body offered, His blood poured and contemporarily He declared the sense of His death: "for you." His death was a death for us. And why should He have died for us? It is clear, for love. John, the Evangelist, speaks of Jesus who "loved His own, loved them to the very end." (Jn 13,1). His love for us pushed Him to the point of offering Himself as a sacrificial oblation for our salvation.

Jesus then commanded that this event be perpetuated in history: "Do this in memory of me." By means of this testament, Jesus wanted to live and work in the midst of His people even from beyond the event of His death. In the Old Testament, Abraham left his descendants a divine promise. Isaac, Jacob and the other patriarchs left behind a rich benediction: Moses left his people the promised land already foreseen; David left to Solomon a powerful kingdom; Elijah left to Elisha two-thirds of his spirit. Jesus, in his turn, left us much more – He left us Himself because He wanted to remain with us forever and live for us. He wanted to be *Emmanuel* until the end of time. Our Salesian roots, from the very mind and heart of Don Bosco and of Mother Mazzarello, have left us this precious heredity: the living devotion to the Holy Eucharist.

The Eucharist is indeed the source of our Salesian pastoral charity, our sharing in Christ's heart and spirit, the experience of our union with God, our communion in the Church, the endorsement of the special gift of our predilection for the young, the never dying source of our kindness, friendship, optimism and joy, the fount of our daily commitment to work and temperance, and the defining point of the practical and creative nature of our approach to apostolic work. In simple words, it is the one, absolute motivating force behind the Salesian spirit.

In the life of Don Bosco, the Eucharistic point of view was attractive and stimulating. Here we recall just a few aspects which are well known and serve as a true guide. Christ, who dominated the whole existence of Don Bosco, was by preference, Jesus alive and present in the Eucharist, the master of the house, the bread of life, the gravitational center towards which everything converged. When Don Bosco spoke of God, it was often in terms of Jesus in the Eucharist, true Man and true God, who came down from heaven to save us, who died on the cross for us and who is living still on our altars, in our tabernacles and in our communion of hearts. Nothing could be more easily accessible, and at the same time, more thrilling. To have Jesus in the house in fact, meant that one could go and meet Him whenever one wished, take part in His death and resurrection intimately, have a heart-to-heart conversation with Him, receive Him in Communion and be transformed by His Spirit for the mission.

The life of our Founder, right from his early boyhood, and the history of the first Oratory constituted a hymn of praise to the Eucharistic Lord. The feelings that filled the minds of the better ones among his boys can be deduced from the following profound words of Dominic Savio: "When I pass close to Him (Jesus in the Eucharist), not only would I cast myself in the mud to honour him; I would even throw myself into a furnace so as to share in some way in that infinite fire of love which drove him to institute this great Sacrament".

The wisdom of Mother Mazzarello was nourished by the Eucharist. Everything at Mornese testifies to this: the window of the Valponasca, the parish church, the chapel of the Collegio, the vineyards, the fields – everything had a sense of the Eucharist, as it recalls the memory of a soul that was profoundly Eucharistic. Accepting this essential and distinct aspect of the spirituality of Mother Mazzarello, our Constitutions place the celebration of the Eucharist at "the center of the day". The Eucharist is "the moment in which our community is built up and renewed", the "source and culmination of our prayer" (Constitutions 40).

Mother Mazzarello recommended: "Receive with love that Jesus who loves you so much" (Letter 11); "Act in such a way that Jesus will willingly stay in your midst" (Letter 49). Following the footsteps of Mother Mazzarello, a wise woman, we discover where her wisdom was nourished. That wisdom which is the transparency of the Divine in the fullness of the human has a Eucharistic essence.

The call to us is simple and clear: that we spend time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Each moment that we spend with Jesus will deepen our union with Him and make our soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in Heaven. It will take us, not only to the eternal peace promised to each one in faith, but will help to bring about everlasting peace here on earth.

ALL SAINTS DAY: (November 01) The solemnity of All Saints reminds us that the whole Christian life is about turning from sin and giving ourselves completely to God. This is not an easy process, but God gives us everything we need to succeed. And the reward is, "we shall see [God] as He is." This day we celebrate all the Saints who have gone before us who remind us that we can be part of the communion of saints, known and also unknown, if we allow God to make us pure. Let us go deep into ourselves and see the saintly elements that are present in us and develop them more and more.

ALL SOULS DAY: (November 02) All Souls Day reminds us of the reality that all of us have an appointed time to leave this world. This world is a permanent home to none of us. No doubt, death causes grief and sadness, but without it there cannot be the most desirable and eternal gifts: peace, joy and eternal bliss in God. Therefore, let us pray for our departed family members, our Sisters, especially for those souls who died in unforeseen circumstances such as violence or other calamities, all those who are most in need of our prayers.

SAINT ARTEMIDES ZATTI SDB: (November 13) The Zatti family moved, in the hopes of a better life, from Italy to Argentina, the country Don Bosco had dreamt of. It was there that young Artemide, discovered his Salesian vocation, which he lived in a passionate, competent service and with a great love for the sick. For about fifty years he lived in Viedma, Argentina, as an outstanding religious who devoted his life in helping the sick, specially the poor among them. His life as a follower of Jesus, living his consecration at every moment of his life in perpetual unity with God and in gospel fraternity, touched instantly all whom he met. Artemide, inspite of all his hectic service, never lost the sense of community, for he was always present for daily prayers, moments of fraternal gatherings at table and other occasions for sharing the joy of family. Let his example serve as motivation for us to live more lovingly and enthusiastically our community Communion.

CHILDREN'S DAY: (November 14) We know well that this date that marks the birth anniversary of independent India's first Prime Minister - Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, has been chosen for the celebration of children owing to the love and passion he had for children. While celebrating Children's Day, the children in our Institutions and around us need to be reminded about being grateful for all that they are endowed with in life, while there are others who have barely anything to eat or to clothe themselves, or have access to literacy, or sources of wellbeing in the society. We need to form these children and young people to be grateful for what they have and help them to experience the joy of sharing.

BLESSED MAGDALENE MORANO FMA: (November 15) Magdalene Morano was a person endowed with love, goodness, intelligence, vivacity, and wisdom. She was a "teacher" par excellence. She had a life of profound oneness with God, as a young teacher, visiting the ill, teaching catechism, preparing students for the sacrament, and serving the parish community. Even now, her life serves as a joyous and fervent example of love, encouraging us to educate women and young people about evangelization. May she pray for us, that we might endeavour, as she did, to travel the road of holiness with the young!

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR: (November 19) The Church celebrates the seventh annual World Day of the Poor on 19th November 2023. The message of His Holiness Pope Francis, for the 2023 World Day of the poor is: "Do not turn your face away from anyone who is poor" (Tob 4:7). These words help us to understand the essence of our witness. The call of every Christian is to become personally involved and particularly sensitive to the needs of the poor.

THE ARRIVAL OF THE PIONEERS: (November 24) We shall celebrate the 101 amazing years of the FMA's presence in India on November 24, 2023. We honour the Six Pioneers who came to Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu, for their tireless efforts, diligence, and dedication to till the Indian soil, plant the powerful seed of Salesian charism and spread God's Kingdom. May the Lord continue to bless the Seven Provinces of India in their growth, progress, and prosperity. May He make us holy every day and provide our Provinces many more vocations.

SERVANT OF GOD MARGARET OCCHIENA: (November 25) "Parents are the first educators of children in God's plan," declared Pope Pius XII in 1940. In order to comprehend Don Bosco's journey toward fulfilling his childhood dream of shepherding the abandoned youth, it is important to consider the type of education his own mother had offered him. Her profound spirituality and personal sanctity, her strong faith in God, her brave detachment, and her unwavering love planted in the young John Bosco the idea of priestly commitment, which was soon translated into his passion for Salesian Mission for the Young. The inspiration took Don Bosco well ahead on the path to holiness.

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING: (November 26) On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. It marks the end of the year, announcing the forthcoming Advent, the opening of another new liturgical year. This feast is a fitting way to end the year and start another, with Advent the season in which we prepare our hearts to more fully understand and accept God's presence among us in the person of Jesus. The feast reminds us that Jesus will come again, will reach out to us at the end of time, to usher in the fullness of God's Reign. On this feast of Christ the King, let us allow Christ to reign in our minds, our wills, our hearts, and our bodies!
