My dear Sisters,

Tiruchirapalli - India

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes from Tiruchirappalli.

In the Salesian tradition, the month of May is deeply meaningful as it is dedicated to Mary Help of Christians. Blessed Mother Mary holds a central place in our hearts, closely intertwined with the life and mission of our Founder St. John Bosco. He had a profound devotion to Mary Help of Christians, whom he regarded as his special advocate and guide in his work with young people. He often attributed the successes of his ministry to her intercession and placed great trust in her maternal care.

To express his gratitude to Mary Help of Christians Don Bosco built in 1868 a basilica named after her in Valdocco (Turin), and also wanted this act to be perpetuated as a 'Living Monument' by founding in 1872, together with St. Maria Domenica Mazzarello, the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians.

On a 24 May evening 1868, four years before the foundation of our Institute, St. John Bosco shared a vision with Fr. Bonetti. As they watched the illuminated Basilica and joyful boys in the courtyard, Fr. Bonetti remarked on the miracle of Our Lady. "Then Don Bosco stopped and added: 'But a stone monument is not enough to sing our gratitude to Our Lady. We will have a living monument.' Fr. Bonetti looked at him, not understanding what Don Bosco meant. Don Bosco, realizing from Fr. Bonetti's look that he had not understood his affirmation, continued: 'Yes, we will have a living monument and this living monument will be the sisters.' It was the first time Don Bosco had spoken of sisters."

The FMA Constitutions Article 04 affirms: "Mary Most Holy inspired our Institute, and continues to be its mother and teacher. We are, therefore, "a religious Family that belongs entirely to Mary". Don Bosco wanted us to be "a living monument" of his gratitude to Mary Help of Christians, and asks us to extend his thanks throughout all time.

- To be a living monument of gratitude to Mary means that we, the Salesian Sisters, are called to follow Mary's virtues of humility, compassion, and selflessness in our daily lives and ministries. It means recognizing Mary's guidance and protection in our work, and expressing our thankfulness through our words, actions, and prayers.
- To be a Monument means being witness, a sign and reminder of an event. It means raising a memorial to a person. Mary is eminently a woman of Memory, who "kept all

of these things in her heart", who witnesses to the great things carried out by God in her and in history.

- *To be a monument like Mary, the Woman of Memory*, means to remember with love, to think with our hearts. In the Bible, the heart represents the deepest part of who we are, where our truest self-resides. From this place, our decisions and actions spring forth, shaping our entire being.
- To be a monument of gratitude like Mary, the Virgin of the Magnificat, means expressing profound thankfulness and humility. Just as Mary humbly accepted her role in God's plan, we too can discover His greatness through humility. Similarly, when we approach life with humility and gratitude, we can uncover the profound blessings and wonders that God has bestowed upon us. Mary's example inspires us to acknowledge God's goodness and mercy, magnifying His glory through our words and deeds.
- To be a monument of gratitude like Mary, the helper and prophet, means to imitate her role as a compassionate guide and messenger of God's word. Mary's example inspires us to extend a helping hand to those in need and to proclaim the message of love and salvation to the world.

The former Mother General, Sr. Yvonne Reungoat, in Circular 995, highlights this special aspect of every FMA vocation. "In our heart lives the joy of knowing that we are the 'living monument of gratitude to Mary Help of Christians' wanted by Don Bosco as 'perennial gratitude for the singular favors obtained by such a good Mother' (MB X, 600). Our Founder built it with 'living stones' that have a precise name: the name of each one of us. He wanted it to be dynamic, creative, constantly expanding, pervaded by an inner tension of growth, capable of affecting society and the Church, doing 'great good' to young people. (...) Like her, we too are called to live the joy of the Magnificat with humility, prolonging her presence in history. In fact, we too are called to be like her 'helpers' among the young people, with a gaze of predilection on those who are subject to various forms of poverty and who await hope and trust in life (cf. C 4 and 65)."

Don Bosco felt that alone he would never be able to thank Our Lady for what she had done in his life and in the history of the Congregation he had founded and which was expanding more and more without his even knowing how. In order to find a way to express fervent gratitude to Our Lady, Don Bosco thought of consecrated hearts. And this is how we came to be, right from his heart. Each of us was present in the heart of Don Bosco through Mary's inspiration, as a living thank you to Our Lady. Each of us is a Thank you to Mary, she is a Thank you from the heart of a saint. And while Don Bosco today in Heaven says his thanks to Our Lady, we say it on earth, with our life!".

Dominic's firm commitment to purity and virtue is reflected in his adoption of the motto "Death, but not sin!" at his first Communion, manifesting his steadfast resolve to live a life pleasing to God. Guided by St. John Bosco, Dominic embraced a balanced spirituality, emphasizing cheerfulness and diligence in his duties. His humble aspiration to glorify God in every small action serves as a timeless example for today's youth, inspiring them to live lives of faith, integrity, and service to others. May St. Dominic Savio continue to be a beacon of light and a model of holiness for all young people, guiding them on their journey of faith and virtue.
