My Dearest Sisters. Loving greetings from Tiruchirappalli.

As we begin the month dedicated to Our Blessed Mother of the Holy Rosary, I would like to reflect with you on Mary's presence in our Institute and in the life of each one of us. As our Constitutions affirm, ours is a Religious Family that belongs entirely to Mary (cf. Cons. n. 4); we are an Institute willed by God and guided by Our Blessed Mother. Let our deeper conviction of this bring us to ever new discoveries of the motherly presence of Mary in our lives and specially in the Institute from its beginning and at every step of its development. Don Bosco's words to the sisters at his last visit to Nizza Monferrato in 1885, "Mary walks in this house" (Cf. Cronistoria V, 51-52) was a very clear confirmation of her tangible and maternal presence in all our houses. Wherever Mary is present as protector, guide and inspirer, she helps us to live the generative power of the Charism in today's history. "Mary walks with us," is not an abstract phrase but a reality that evokes a 'vision', a certainty, rooted in faith and in the Salesian Charism, a lived experience.

In the life of Don Bosco, Mary was a living and guiding presence throughout his life, and he firmly believed in her presence and guidance. He developed a tender and personal relationship, and expressed his devotion through continuous prayer and dedication to his work and mission. He was determined that he would never be able to thank Our Blessed Mother for what she had done in his life and in the Congregation, he had founded, which was expanding more and more. In order to find a way to express his fervent gratitude to Our Mother, Don Bosco thought of consecrated hearts as living monuments and that is how we came to be, right from his heart. Each of us was present in the heart of Don Bosco through Mary's inspiration, as a living sign of thanks to Our Blessed Mother.

Our beloved former General, Mother Yvonne Reungoat, in her Circular (n. 995), had highlighted this special aspect of our FMA vocation: "In our heart lives the joy of knowing that we are the 'living monument of gratitude to Mary Help of Christians' wanted by Don Bosco as 'perennial gratitude for the singular favors obtained by such a good Mother' (MB X, 600). Our Founder built it with 'living stones' that have a precise name: the name of each one of us. He wanted it to be dynamic, creative, constantly expanding, pervaded by an inner tension of growth, capable of affecting society and the Church, doing 'great good' to young people. Like her, we too are called to live the joy of the Magnificat with humility, prolonging her presence in history. In fact, we too are called to be like her 'helpers' among the young people, with a gaze of predilection on those who are subject to various forms of poverty and who await hope and trust in life (cf. Cons. n. 4 and n. 65)."

At Mornese, as at Nizza, Mary was not a guest, she was the head of the house. It was she, in fact, who guided the community. Mother Mazzarello related to her as a daughter with great confidence. She placed the keys of the house at the foot of the image of Mary and entrusted to her the heart of each person in the community. The entrustment of the house keys symbolized who the head of the family was. Thus, the real Superior was indeed, Mary Help of Christians, of whom Mother felt

she was the Vicar. The keys 'open, close and guard' the intimacy of the house: the keys that open express welcome; the keys that lock, preserve and guard the family.

The community experienced her protection and motherly presence. Mother Mazzarello recommended to the sisters that they should be, and act like, "true images of Mary". The Marian dimension of our charism is not a self-centered relationship, nor an excuse for social silence, but it is a call to participate in the events of the society. It consists of making our own, the attitudes of Mary as mother and teacher of God's children, journeying towards fullness of life in Christ. This in short is "to help Jesus grow in the hearts of the young".

Mary our Help, accompanies us at this time of great transformation and uncertainty, of fear and enthusiasm, so that the newness of God may make progress even in this moment of history. She, who in the Magnificat, sang of the presence of God in her own life and in the events of her people's history, points out prophetic ways for us, where the poor of the earth are filled with good things, the oppressed find a hand that lifts them up again, cultures discover their genuine identity and unite to sing to the Lord who is faithful to His promises forever.

The role of Mother Mary in the lives of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello is an inspiration for us. The same Mother continues to accompany us in all the events and situations of our personal life and mission. May Mother Mary be a guiding star, a mother who never deserts her children, a sure hope in time of desperation, a mother in times of pain and suffering, an inspirer in the time of discouragement, and a perfect model to look upon and to love and imitate. She is indeed our mother and the mother of all humankind.

As we enter into the month of Holy Rosary, let us be faithful in praying the Rosary as a community and instill the same fervour in the hearts of the young with love for our Blessed Mother, our Teacher and Guide.

"Blessed those houses," Don Bosco said, "in which the Rosary resounds". Blessed those communities in which attentive and devout recitation of the Rosary becomes a communion of minds and a harmonious agreement of hearts, giving expression to filial prayer and lover for our Blessed Mother. Don Bosco "never permitted a dispensation from a community recitation of the Rosary for any reason. It was for him an indispensable exercise of piety for a good life; the daily bread to keep oneself strong and fit." Rosary, according to him, is a weapon which gives victory not only to individuals, but to the whole Church.

Dear loving Sisters, let us grow in our attachment to the holy Rosary that it may sustain us in dangers, draw us ever closer towards sanctity, a sanctity which shines in all its fullness in our heavenly Mother.

For our personal Reflection:

- Am I conscious of Mary's active presence in my life and that my identity as Daughter of Mary help of Christians is proportionate to the measure I follow faithfully her footsteps, making her known to all whom I encounter in my mission?
- Do I create, in and around me, a Marian atmosphere that will reflect the Marian Spirituality of our Institute?

FEAST OF GUARDIAN ANGELS: The truth that each and every human soul has a Guardian Angel who protects us from both spiritual and physical evil has been shown throughout the Old Testament, and is made very clear in the New. It is written that the Lord Jesus was strengthened by an angel in the Garden of Gethsemane, and that an angel delivered St. Peter from prison in the Acts of the Apostles. But Jesus makes the existence and function of guardian angels explicit when

he says, "See that you despise not one of these little ones: for I say to you, that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 18:10). Let us inculcate devotion to Guardian angels among the young people so that during trials and temptations they may invoke their Guardian Angels.

ST. FRANCIS ASSISI: "St. Francis invites us to see that all created things are brothers and sisters, that we are interdependent." He considered the nature as the mirror of God and as so many steps to God. From 01 September (World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation) to the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi on 04 October, this month-long celebration offers us time to reflect on the needs of our planet and what we can do in our communities to make a difference. This year, the closing of the Season of Creation on 04 October, the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, will coincide with the opening of the Synod on Synodality. The entire People of God is being invited to an immersive journey of synodal dialogue and conversion. As followers of Christ on our shared synodal journey, let us live, work and pray that our common home will teem with life once again. With and like St. Francis let's praise God for creation, pledging to do our part to be a faithful steward of what He has given us.

ST. TERESA OF AVILA: On 15th October we honor Saint Teresa of Avila, Patroness of our Institute. She was an example of the extraordinary role that women have played throughout history in the Church and in the society. Pope Francis noted that her message and example are for everyone, "for those who feel the call to religious life," but also "for all those who wish to progress on the path of purification from all worldliness, which leads to union with God, to the lofty abodes of the interior castle." One of the key hallmarks of the spiritual heights of Saint Teresa of Avila is the importance of prayer. She believed that the most powerful and acceptable prayer was that prayer that leads to action. Good effects were better than pious sensations that only make the person praying feel good. Through the teaching and intercession of Saint Teresa of Avila, may we persevere in prayer and acts of loving kindness.

BLESSED DON MICHAEL RUA: Don Rua - much more than a disciple, a friend, a son or a successor, God gave St. John Bosco another himself to expand his work. Don Rua's strict fidelity, fatherliness imbued with delicacy and his wise and far-seeing actions earned for him the title of "The Living Rule". Let us imitate the same gentleness, humility, simplicity, grandeur of soul and joy that radiates around him and become the spiritual heirs of Saint John Bosco.
