As Jesus says “I have come to bring fire on the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! (Lk 12:49) let the fire of love of God enkindle in us the courage and commitment to fight against the evils that weaken the light of hope and peace of our younger generation. Let us not forget the words of St. Paul “For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands” (2 Timothy 1:6). We are all born with divine fire in us. Let our efforts give wings to this fire to work for our young people and fill the world with the glow of His goodness.

H₂O SUMMER CAMP

Summer camp is a free space for children to learn and explore new things which are essential in day-to-day life, so as part of summer camp, this year we came forward with the title of H₂O Summer Camp 2024. This camp's main objective is to raise awareness about **Sustainable Development Goals and Greywater Management system**, an essential sustainable method for recycling water. This camp was held in the month of May with the initiative of Sisters and volunteers at each center.





In the initial days of the camp, we taught the children about Sustainable Development Goals and their importance. Then in the middle days of the camp we taught about Greywater Management and its advantages.

The water which comes from the bathrooms, sinks, showers, washing machines, dish washers and excluding toilets water can be called Greywater. If this Greywater is managed properly by using a Greywater management system, it can be used for irrigation of plants and trees and for flushing toilets.

Recreation activities during camp:

- They had prayer moments,
- Group activities
- Cultural programmes
- Field trips
- And Provided snacks and drinks for all the children.

Outcomes of the H₂O Summer Camp:

- Greater exposure for both teachers and children regarding Sustainable Development Goals and Greywater Management System.
- Understood the usage and wastage of water by each household in the villages.
- Children are curious to communicate with community or relative, families in sharing the knowledge what they were taught in the camp.
- Now children are aware and can be able to reuse the Greywater from their home to plants and trees.
- Children are exposed to more creative learnings and able to participate in group activities joyfully.

Annual Retreat for workers :

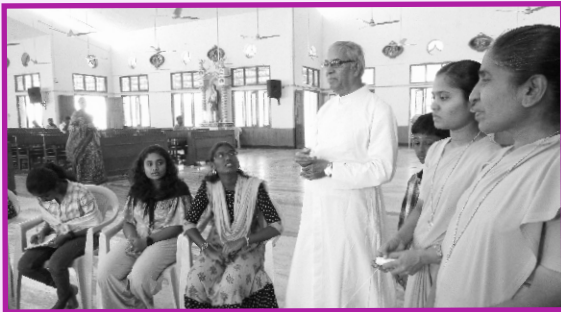
"Come to me, all of you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Annual Day Celebration

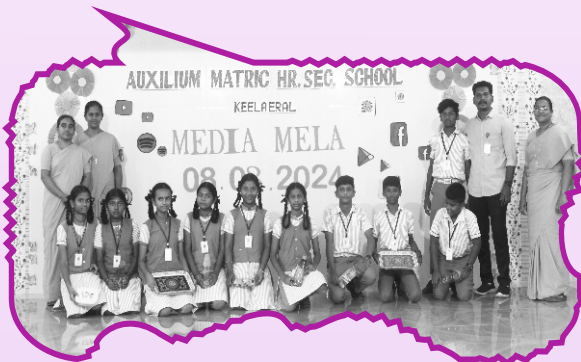
