Sr. Auxilia shares her journey as a missionary in South Sudan

### Dear Sr. Auxilia please share about your life in the family.

I was born and brought up in a happy family. My family is a gratuitous gift of God who is good to all and at all times. We were eleven childrensix daughters and five sons for our parents. My dad Joseph Amal and my mum Rajathi were exemplary parents. They were of one mind and heart in bringing us up with their example of faith, patience and good relationship. Three girls from the family became Salesian Sisters - Sr. Magdalane, Sr. Annie and I, another sister joined the Sisters of St. Anne, and one sister Sagayamary is a lay Auxiliaries of Apostles and two elder brothers are married and one younger brother is unmarried.

The childhood experience that I still cherish is that as a joyful family we prayed together, ate together, enjoyed certain moments like visiting the annual exhibition, circus and watching some good movies in the theater and we also shared few moments of misfortune together. Moments of character building were mingled with sense of humor that made these times lighter.

## What motivated you to become an FMA?

From my childhood I had the desire to give myself to God in the religious life. When I was in class 9 our Sisters came to my parish for three days vocation camp which my sisters Annie and Sagayamary participated and I did not participate but I went on the last day only to see the film of Mother Mazzarello. Later Mother Helen Fernandes sent the life of Laura Vicuna in Tamil, a medal of Laura and a short loving note through my sister, Sr. Magdalane FMA. Mother Mazzarello's cheerful life with the children and teenagers of Mornese and the life of Laura lived with our sisters in our boarding that had the family atmosphere attracted me to join the FMA.

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As an Aspirant I had the desire to become a missionary and I chose books on our sisters' life for my spiritual reading. I was greatly inspired by the life of Mother Troncatti. Her life lived in the missions, the

Good night thoughts of our Pioneers - Mother Teresa Merlo and Sr. Consiglia Tarricone in the Novitiate and the sharing of the Juba Mission in Sudan (at present South Sudan) by Fr. Tony De' Souza SDB when I was a Novice strengthened my desire. I opted for the missions when our Mother General Mother Marinella Castagna asked Sisters for Africa Project. My application was accepted and I was and I am very happy and grateful to God, our Blessed Mother, our Superiors and Sisters for my Missionary Vocation.

# What was your experience and feelings when you first stepped into Ethiopia?



When I first stepped into Ethiopia I was happy and enthusiastic to serve young people as they were open and delighted to be with us in the oratory which was our only apostolate at that time in the community of Sacred Heart Home in Addis Ababa, the capital city of Ethiopia.

I was glad to be in the community with the multi-national Sisters. The faith, spirit of hospitality and solidarity of the people of this land were great inspiration and remarkable one which impressed me a lot.

# # How did the people respond to you?

In the initial stage they resisted the education of girls. As they gradually became convinced about the power of education which would enable them to have a dignified life by eradicating poverty, they wanted to educate their children who were the first generation learners. Since all Ethiopians are expected to complete their primary education as per the Millennium goals, many adults are learning their lessons with enthusiasm and pride. Don Bosco's first apostolate was oratory and Oratories are flourishing till today. Our Oratories are filled with 250 to 500 children and young people. As they are getting educated in academics and Christian life they are improving in their response to the initiatives of Sisters.

## Please share an unforgettable experience in your mission land.

There are many experiences. Let me share just one experience about the Kindergarten Registration in one of our schools. It was my second year

in Ethiopia and the first year in the mission of Zway in the Shoa region. At 8.00 a.m. on the day of registration I went to the office with Sr. Giuseppina Boldi (Animator of the community) and Sr. Anna Opezzo (Sister responsible for the Kindergarten). There was a very long queue of children standing with one of their family member. Amidst them there was a tiny little child without anybody and holding tightly in her little right hand the fee for registration. When she reached the desk, Sister asked her, "Who has come with you"? Bruktait answered, "Nobody. I have only mother. She is in the market and told me to go and register. Here is the registration fee". Looking at the child my eyes were filled with tears. Sr. Giuseppina told me to go home and come after some time. I said to myself how at this tender age (4 years old) this little one has to face the realities of life. She was admitted in the Kindergarten and she was regular to school with great joy.

## What would it mean to embrace the periphery?

To embrace periphery is explicitly Cristo Centric. It means to share what we can share: gestures of goodness, compassion, forgiveness, mercy, acts of justice and what we have: time, talents, knowledge, goods, money, our unused ambient with materially poor children and young people, marginalized by the rich starting from our locality gradually to extend to other places. As Salesian Sisters to do these above mentioned together with our young people so that their joy may be complete is embracing the periphery.

### What is your message for the young Sisters?

The young Sisters should allow themselves be transformed by encountering the person of Jesus in their life and in that of others. They should be with Mary who is present in our life and in our houses as a guiding mother filled with filial love. Learn to give lavishly and live abundantly for we have received freely and so we are called to give freely, cost what it may. Let us be Missionaries of Joy and Hope with the young, journeying with them along the way of holiness. Let us accompany each other with our prayers.

# "We encountered HIM on that day"

 ${\cal A}$  College Circular announcing that the students who failed to pay the Semester fees after the



due date with fine will not be allowed to appear for the Final Semester examination was displayed. This was one of the usual circular notices which we never bothered until it touched our skin.

The usual evening fun and laughter in the Hostel room disappeared that day and we were indeed stunned to see one of our beloved roommates named Reshma, crying pathetically. After a long silence she told us that she

had not yet paid the final semester fees and there was no way that she could afford to pay it within that given two weeks. With tears she explained that her father who was the only breadwinner of the family could not earn enough as a coolie fisherman to run the family. Further, nothing of those valuable goods of the house could be sold too and the family was already suffering with excessive debts.

We, the roommates and other 10 of my friends who belonged to different religions but lived in the same Hostel and used to come together to my room to read and pray with the Bible every evening were feeling helpless regarding the situation. As Reshma was my roommate, we simply trusted and turned to Jesus to seek. His help. It was a Thursday evening when we implored Jesus' Mercy and compassion for our Reshma to meet her needs. We hoped that she must get the money miraculously, for the family had all the doors closed to do so. At the end during the prayer we were inspired to read the particular passage from the Bible: "Today I declare that I will restore to you double" Zech 9: 12 we read and believed and some of my friends of other religions were curiously expecting to see this miracle saying "Nothing is impossible to Jesus."

Meanwhile it was announced that the hostel would be closed that week end and all the hostlers should submit the leave form on Friday itself. Reshma was restless and anxious and I continued to console her and asked her to believe in Jesus. The next day evening we wished each other and left the hostel. As we were reaching the bus stand to take a bus for our home town, we heard from some of her relatives exclaiming that Reshma's father was a lucky man to get such a coolie within a day! For they said that the owner of the fishing boat along with Reshma's father and two other helpers went for fishing and that Friday early morning there was a fish which got into their net. Since the fish was very big, the four men could not manage to pull the net out. They decided to let the net loose and to let the fish go out of the net. But the fish was not moving so after much difficulty and with the help of the other boats men they managed to drag the fish till the shore. The news spread everywhere in the village and that fish was sold for some lakhs and her father got the coolie which was exactly double the amount of the fund that Reshma was in need of.

Praise be to Jesus whose promises are ever true and His love is everlasting. Our simple prayer with faith was answered astonishingly and indeed this great miracle helped us to understand that "God's ways are incomprehensible; our faith in God intensifies when we invite Jesus into our lives and our faith in God is strengthened by the evidence and grounded in a transformed life."



#### NOVICE FORMATORS MEET

The meeting of the Novice Formators was held in Rome from October 1st to

20<sup>th</sup> 2017. The theme of the meeting was "At the root of a perpetual vitality: The Constitutions, A life plan that forms and transforms". Twenty six Novice Formators reached Rome on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2017 from different parts of the World. The inaugural ceremony was held on the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2017. During the Prayer service each



Novice Formator was invited to sow a mustard seed symbolically inviting them to take care of the seed which has the potential to become a tree. Sr. Nieves Reboso presented the 20 days programme. In the inaugural address she said that there is an urgent need to start a process of reflection on how to convey, help and transmit the treasures of the charism with its prophetic value to young people of today, so that it might be assimilated vitally. They were guided by the theme: United in the Community in the name of the Lord and sent to youth in the spirit of the 'da mihi animas' as the horizon of an ongoing process of formation which included Articles 36-76 of our Constitutions. Therefore the participants concentrated on Prayer, Fraternal Life and Mission. The following objectives were presented:

1. To have an experience that shapes, transforms and qualifies the ministry

of discernment, accompaniment and guidance of the formation journey of the Novices.

- 2. To form oneself to accompany the Novices, understanding the present context ,being united in a community in the name of the Lord and sent to the young people in the spirit of the da mihi animas.
- 3. To assume the responsibility for self-education in an ongoing formation process to form oneself and others to 'docibilitas'.
- 4. To deepen one's study of some aspects of youth ministry as Formators, such as discernment, accompaniment, formative itinerary and study program and the formative community.
- 5. To develop didactic aids that guide the transmission of the Constitutions to encourage, throughout the Institute, a unified and differentiated path, depending on the socio-cultural context.

To arrive at the objectives they were divided into 4 groups. For every topic input session was conducted by experts and then Constitutions Articles were divided and assigned to the groups for study. The following strategy was used to deepen the Constitution Articles.

The important elements that should be focused in the presentation of the articles

- Listening to ones own experiences and reality (our thoughts, feelings and knowledge)
- Presentation of the content of the articles
- Some reference texts for deepening the content
- Some suggestions for a vital synthesis
- Sharing and paying attention for inculturation in ones context
- Sharing the problems, questions and challenges during reflections and research together

Constitutions articles from 36-76 were studied in groups and was presented to the assembly, after discussions and clarifications, conclusions were arrived.

Sr. Azarias Arokia Mary Selvi and Sr. Thomas Sirumani Sathya attended three days IX Annual General Body Meeting Of The Asian Movement Of Women Religious Against Human Trafficking (AMRAT) at Indian Social Institute, Bengaluru. There were more than 100 Catholic Nuns from various Congregations - India and Sri Lanka.

There was two days capacity building program organized along with the general body meeting that began on 10th November 2017. According to AMRAT, human trafficking is lucrative trade in humans, mostly for sex, forced labor and for extraction of human organs or tissues. Founded in 2009, AMRAT covers India, Nepal, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. One of the objectives of AMRAT is to identify the congregations, organizations and institutions to enlist new member to support each other in counteracting human trafficking especially among women and children. Archbishop Bernard Moras of Bangalore in his keynote address said that human trafficking is a major concern for the Church and the Archdiocese will provide all support to the Sisters who are fighting against it. He paid tributes to AMRAT which is networking among the congregations to bring human dignity to all.

Fr. Edward Thomas SDB, director of Dream India, spoke on missing children and Mr. Luckose Vallathara, a retired Indian Administrative Service Officer spoke on child labour and child trafficking. The International Justice Mission (IJM) team from Bangalore gave awareness on Bonded Labour. Sr. Lissy Rose - Sisters of Mary Immaculate (SMI),



Coordinator of AMRAT Karnataka Unit, welcomed the participants and guests of the meeting.

Fr. Stanislus D'Souza, Provincial of the Jesuits in Karnataka, commended AMRAT for being a convergence of different women religious congregations in the region. 

## CATECHETICAL SEMINAR FOR CATHOLIC TEACHERS Archbishop Louis Mathias Home - Thiruvottiyur, Chennai -19

To foster total personal and spiritual growth of each Catholic teacher, the Catechetical Seminar was animated at Thiruvottiyur Arch Bishop Louis Mathias Home on the theme "Relationship as Spirituality in Families". Sr. Arockiam Gracy Rani FMA the Catechetical Co-ordinator of the Province of Trichy animated the seminar for thirty teachers working in three schools



#### CATECHETICAL SEMINAR FOR CATHOLIC TEACHERS



However, they can only use each name once. The people who perform the task are to sign next to that statement. The first person who fills the entire sheet with signatures is the winner.

#### **Origin**

Under Mary's maternal leadership the new community was founded on 27<sup>th</sup> May 2006in Ulagampatti. Sr. Mary Ann Fernando the then Provincial along with the community Sisters of Marianathapuram initiated the Salesian Charism in this second presence in Dindigul Diocese. Sr. Amutha Fernando and Sr. Auxilia Periyanayagam were the pioneers of this mission.

#### **Context**

Agaram Panchayat has an average literacy rate of 58%, lower than the national average of 59.5%; with 58% of the males and 42% of females literate. 11% of the population is under 6 years of age.

Agriculture is the chief occupation. The land is owned by the few landlords and the majority of the population is employed as agricultural laborers.

Casteism is highly prevalent in this area and people are discriminated and oppressed based on caste.

The majority of the populations are Catholics who are traditional Christians. Though they are Christians for many generations the effects of the established culture are easily traceable in their mentality and dealings.

#### Mission

The Salesian Sisters were invited to strengthen the faith life of the Parishioners and dignify the quality of life of every person in this locality through evangelization and education.

- A Sister is given the post of Headmistress in the Parish Primary School in Ulagampatti.
- Sisters render their service in the Parish Liturgical Animation, Parish Catechism, and preparation for the reception of Sacraments, animate the Basic Christian Communities and visit the families
- Sisters run Evening study centers in the villages to prevent drop outs and facilitate quality learnings for the first generation learners.
- Neighborhood Children Parliaments are formed and followed to inculcate responsible leadership among children.
- Cooperators unit function as the extended arm in reaching out to the unreached with Salesian Spirit.
