

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
Editorial

Missionary Impact

A glimpse into the life of Mother Galina Cesira

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary one of the students of Mother Cesira worked as a teacher in our institute for thirty three years. This is an interview with Mrs. Uthiriya Mary about Mother Cesira.

Sister : Where and when did you meet Mother Cesira?

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary: I met her first when I was a student in St. Mary's School

in Katpadi. I was enchanted by her loving kindness.

Sister : Can you share some of the sweet memories you have

about Mother Cesira?

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary: With pleasure. I had completed my Teachers Training when

the construction of Auxilium College had already commenced. When I was in my twenties, Mother Cesira had a lot of trust in me. She invited me to come to Katpadi. As the construction of ACK building was in progress, I was asked by her to collaborate with Sr. Nancy and help her in the accounts. One day Mother Cesira came to supervise the work. She took me with her to see the building. As we were climbing down the stairs, suddenly a part of the building collapsed. Both of us were struck with fear. Immediately she held me with love, and assured me as she said: "God has saved your life and I have saved you. God will bless you with a longer life." Her joy knew no bounds as I was saved from the danger. I am spell bound by her motherliness. I can never forget this experience. As per her prophecy, God has blessed me with a long life.

Sister : What transformation has she brought in your life?

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary: She was not pleased to hear from us the words "I can't"

She believed that the magic word for success is "I can and I will". This insight has increased in me my self-confidence. Her love and concern has helped me to be an accomplished

teacher.

Sister : What are the personal traits of Mother Cesira?

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary: Mother Cesira can be called "Mother of the Poorest and

the orphans". She had passionate love for the poor children. She had a limpid charming smile on her face. She is noted for her loving yet firm Sisterly corrections. Today we speak a lot about the rights of children but sixty four years ago Mother worked hard to uphold the rights of the children for education, health, hygiene and ensured a happy environment for the growth of the children. She entrusted us with lot of responsibilities and enhanced our self-confidence.

Sister : What are the Salesian characteristics that you found in Mother Cesira?

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary: Creating a happy atmosphere. Establishing a genuine friendly teacher student relationship were predominant in her. All the Sisters and teachers guided us and set us models to be followed. She taught us to be happy amidst worries and stress of each day. We learnt to live in the presence of God. The conviction that she imparted that God takes care of us and comes to our aid strengthened us

to face life confidently.

Sister : You had been a dedicated teacher for the past thirty three years. Can you share something about student teacher rapport?

Mrs. Uthiriya Mary: I shared the same love that I had for my daughters with my students. The students were very affectionate towards the teachers. But today things are different. There is stress and violence in student teacher rapport. Today the relationship between the students and teachers are solely based on class rooms, tests, exams and marks.

Mrs. Clotty was one of the orphans brought up by Mother Cesira. She has four children and lives in AuxiliumKatpadi. This is an interview with the Mrs. Clotty about Mother Cesira.

Sister : Could you share your reminiscence of Mother Cesira Galina?

Mrs. Clotty: When I was one year old, I was adopted and brought up by

Mother Cesira. I was with her when she was in Arni. I studied in Salesian Schools. When I was a child, I fondly remember being affectionately carried by her, fed by her. After dressing me up, I remember being admired by her. Oh I cannot forget the days when she took me for outing. I am enchanted by the way she loved the poor children.

She used to sacrifice a lot to express her love.

Sister : What have you learnt from her?

Mrs. Clotty : I learnt to be contented in encountering all circumstances

of life. I feel fulfilled in the thought that I am one of her

favorite children.

Sister : Can you share some of her personal characteristics?

Mrs. Clotty : I love her compassion. She corrected us with kindness.

Though she occupied a very high position, she never lost sight of us. She was concerned about us and she used to teach us good manners. She loved me with a mother's heart. I called her as Mother. Though she accomplished many things, the one thing which I remember with joy is her simplicity; the way she dealt with us, the manner in which she narrated stories, and the affection with which


she took us out during vacation.

"I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with loving kindness I have drawn thee" – JEREMIAH 31:3



I love thee to the depth and breadth and height my soul cannot reach. I love thee, but thee with a love that shall not die till the sun grows cold and the stars grow old. My soul was restless, my spirit imbued with dryness, my greenish folio's verge started to turn yellow in due season and thus, my feet trotted in spots and my eyes unveiled in eagerness to relentlessly seek out an ardent lover of the Master, to discover the beauty of a remarkably transformed life. I wanted something new, oh; something like chalk and cheese in my life like every other human being aspires always.

I searched in vain unless a gushing spirit invaded me and made me realize, "Why do you search for me in others, when I am present fully in you?" You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. Masking the self-confidence within myself, I worked to banish them by illumining it in the light of others. A pile of papers lay ahead of me as I sat down for my personal reflection. My soul taunted me and a heap of questions swaying across my eyes.

We are all now connected by the Internet in the fast pacing technological world like neurons in a giant brain. But ranging from this modern booming era of android world, I brim with joy in gratitude for the gift of my Salesian vocation. The moments of gratefulness I pen down in these words:-

My detachment of my mother, a single parent, as an only child who was born with all possible pleasures that the youngsters of this epoch would seek and run after, sorting from technological advancements of television, video games, computer, laptop, mobile, t.v. games, LCD (Projector), others like cycle, keyboard, guitar, scooty, and needless to say much more. I leave all these comforts for my Lord, am I not transformed by the encounter?

My first crush with the Eucharistic Jesus in Mumbai as I received Him for the first time, oh, indeed I would say that I am transformed by the encounter for my VOCATION instigated there... desiring as a tiny bud waiting to bloom in the hands of God, looking curiously at the lives of the Sisters unbothered by the external stimuli of people.

My developing love for the Infant Jesus in my school days in New Delhi with the Salesian sisters, oh, doesn't this say that I am transformed by the encounter? For His grace to make me actively involved in the church activities – altar girls, choir, volunteers, children and youth groups and intently look at Him amidst all competent and challenging friends.

My steadfast hold to Blessed Virgin Mary through the marian chants and hymns in my Saelsian boarding at Calcutta with Our Lady of Bandel, Happy Voyage, learning to surrender even my entire family under her care and protection, only in the risk of accepting boarding life to live independently, am not I transformed by the encounter?

My firm and unshakeable decision to follow the Crucified Lord, in Southern region of Tamilnaduinspite of my own experiences in familiar places of North and the Salesian Sisters calling there by, here, I choose a different land, yes, mission life simply drags me like the strangers in a foreign territory willing this to be His plan alone, ya, I feel I am transformed by the encounter.

My experiences of life in various places and yet the assurance and guidance that He gives me to walk forward is stupendous. My late father was a channel to make my discernment irrevocably strong as he did not actually approve it and I had a real tough time as he was not present with me, yet something just led me ahead, isn't it the encounter that transformed me?

I had my determination soaring high and the willingness to wrestle with my demons within me to cause the angels to sing. It's not a seed sown yesterday and a plant nurtured today or tomorrow. For transformation doesn't take place instantly, it takes days, months, and years, as in the life of Saul to become Paul.

Therefore, there's no use only staring at others (as I thought) proclaiming to all that miracles happens only to special people or to virtuous souls and nevertheless, nothing happens to me. But as I view my every day's life until my childhood, will you not agree with me in saying, that each one's lives, like mine are undeniably TRANSFORMED BY THE ENCOUNTER.

NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY

National Girl child day was celebrated on 24th January'18. In order to commemorate the "National Girl Child Day" Marialaya organized a street play in Broadway community at Broadway Bus Terminus. The aim of the programme was to increase the awareness among people about all the inequalities faced by the **girl**

child in the society. The observance of the day enhances the meaningful contribution of the girls in decision making processes through the active support of the parents and other community members. Marialaya also focused to make the people understand that it is necessary to remove



different types of social discrimination and exploitation that girls generally face in their life as a girl child.

The programme started in the Broadway bus stand with our traditional music "parai" in order to gather the general public. Sr. Sebastiar Caroline welcomed the gathering followed by welcoming the Chief Guest Mr.Saravanan, District Child Protection Officer, Chennai.

An awareness song was sung by our community organizer followed by a Street play that emphasised on the Girl child discrimination and the exploitation that she undergoes in each stage of life. The street play also created awareness on the legal rights, equal education and fundamental freedom. Mr.Saravanan DCPO in his speech highlighted on the legal rights and and the fact of life. He also highlighted on legal legislation which we should be aware of as a citizen of society. Legislation includes Prohibition of Child Labour, Child Marriage Act, prevention from Child Abuse and child exploitation etc. Sr. Arul Mary, Director of Marialaya spoke on the significance of Girl Child and aim of celebrating and promoting it to the general public. The programme came to the end, with awareness song followed by vote of thanks by Sr. Caroline.

AWARENESS ON GENDER EQUALITY

The awareness programme was organized and conducted by Marialaya George

Town. More than hundred women participated and the meeting started around 10.30 a.m. with a prayer song followed by welcome speech and entailing the chief guest with memento. The programme was presided by Mrs.Susila, Advocate, Sr. Soosaimuthu Arul Mary, Director of



Marialaya and Sr. Antony Lourdu Sagayam, Province Women Coordinator, Coimbatore. The main aim of the programme was to sensitize the women towards empowerment. Sr. Soosaimuthu Arul Mary insisted that Gender equality does not mean that women and men have to become the same, but their rights, responsibilities and opportunities will not depend on whether they are born male or female. Gender equity means fairness of treatment for women and men, according to their respective needs. Mrs.Susila, Advocate spoke about the life of people in the current scenario and on how people are living concerned chiefly with one's own personal profit and pleasure. She also narrated a life story of a woman "Nangeli", in Nagarkovil who cut off her breasts in an effort to protest caste based breast taxation. She compared the goods and service tax (GST) towards the Napkins used by women which is included in the GST. She also ended up her speech by telling that even though we work more towards women empowerment and development still we lack so many things in today's reality. Sr. Antony Lourdu Sagayam, the Province Women Coordinator, insisted the women to work together for the gender equality and to treat the girls with equal access to education, health care, work, political and economic decision-making processes etc. for the sustainable developments of humanity at large. The Programme came to the end with Vote of thanks by Mrs. Theresa, women group organizer followed by lunch to all the beneficiaries.

MEDICAL CAMP

The free medical camp was organized for the people of Kalyanapuram and Jadkapuram. The aim of the programme is to make the helpful for vulnerable



children and women, who cannot afford expensive procedures and medicines. It started at 9.30 a.m with a welcome speech by Sr. Sebastiar Caroline followed by a prayer song. Mrs. Rose Lilly one of our staff helped us to arrange the doctors and medicine. There were five Doctors and assistants who

came for the medical camp from the Stanley Hospital. Some of the volunteers came to help us for registration and to issue medical cards. General check-up was done by Dr.Shanker MBBS and Dr.Naresh MBBS. More than hundred people had benefited through this camp. Medicines were distributed at the camp itself. Sr. Sebastiar Caroline thanked the doctors, assistants, volunteers and all those who helped for the success of the programme.



CANCER AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The Programme started of around 4:00 pm. The awareness programme was held

at the respective community. It was organized by the Field work students from different college to educate the women in Loans Square area. More than twenty five women and few children participated in the Cancer Awareness Programme.



Thus keeping this as a background study, Marialaya organized community level Outreach programme, in order to sensitize the Community youth and women to prevent the spreading of cancer among women and youth. The meeting started with what is cancer? What are the types of cancer? What are its causes and consequences? The community youth participated actively during the interactive discussion. The resource person also insisted the youth to know on what are the main causes for cancer? How does it develops when we consume tobacco, junk food continuously? The resource person also screened a pictorial presentation and statistical data in order to make them understand even better.



At last the group was encouraged to discuss on how we can save people at its initial stages. After the session, youth were given time to ask doubts and question. The programme came to the end with vote of thanks by the community organizer and Pamphlets were distributed in order to make the

Community people to use their services (Cancer institute services) for free treatment.

On this day we have decided to have an Initial Past Pupil meet in Marialaya Chennai. 30 past pupils participated in the meeting with great enthusiasm. The whole session was led by Sr. Soosaimuthu Arul Mary the Animator of the community. The meeting started at 3.00 pm with a prayer song. Then they have introduced themselves through a music game. During the course of the meeting the past pupils recalled the memories of their stay at Marialaya. They collectively upheld that the values they learned in Marialaya helped them to stand firm in every kind of life situation. Sr. Soosaimuthu Arul Mary appreciated their sense of belonging and she said that this was a golden opportunity to strengthen the bond of the union of each other and with the Salesian family. They thanked the management for their generous availability and asked to animate every month. Finally they came to a conclusion that they would met once in three months. They thanked each other, shared tea and snacks and as a token of love a bed sheet was distributed to each of them.




ANJANA'S SHARING IN PARTICIPATING IN THE PRE SYNODAL MEET IN ROME

To talk about the presynodal journey and experience is always a pleasure, because I believe, that in itself is a witness. As you know, the preparations for the presynod, had started very early. The first of the series of discussions and meetings regarding the preparatory document I attended was in March 2017. So, from then on at various levels some work has always been on.

And as for the presynod itself, I represented the Syro Malabar church. There were altogther 9 delegates from India, including a Hindu and a Sikh. For me, the experience, in a word was transformative. The experiences are wide and varied. Like, meeting different people- from different continents, languages, cultures, religions, ideologies etc. I had two roommates- one from Spain and the other from Columbia. The girl from Spain speaks a little English and the girl from Columbia speaks no English. And I used to talk to her using Google translator because my knowledge of Spanish was limited to 'ola and ciao'. The 300 people were from 5 continents and 120 countries. There were people from as close as Pakistan and as far away as from Chile and I actually talked, interacted and discussed with them different aspects life and faith. There were also representatives of various religions, organizations, universities, departments etc. And for me, this was an experience like never before, and one which I am not sure whether will be repeated.

Another dimension of experience was the meeting itself. The meeting formally began with the interaction with Pope Francis. Yes, we see him almost on a daily basis and also do hear from him. But the experience of really meeting him was so humbling. Papa Francesco, was there with just like one of us, with an easy smile for everyone, talking to us, telling us things and asking us to share. The Holy Seea mighty ruler actually, I cannot ever imagine, our Modiji in that role. But he was there. Not only present but also listening. And for the discussions afterwards the four language groups (English, French, Italian and Spanish) were divided into small working groups. And I was in the English Group 4.







It is in these groups that the majority of discussions took place. And I think, being part of an English group actually enhanced my experience because the members were all from different places and from very different realities. I have been part of the youth ministry in some capacity for the last 11 years, but this was totally new – 6 full days of thinking, talking, walking, eating youth and church and nothing else. The morning mass will give the first thought and then begins the exercise, from breakfast till goodnight (most days I slept after 12- there were so many people to meet, and so many things to listen and share that time was not enough), it was all about youth, life and faith.

Also the Pontifical Mass on the Palm Sunday, was another unforgettable experience. I also met Salesian sisters and past pupils at the presynod. And Sr. Runita, Sr. Lolia and Sr. Celine had come to meet me on 25th. That was actually a moment of pride for me as a Salesian past pupil. As an Indian youth, and especially as a catholic youth – to be more specific, I belong to a minority group (Syro Malabar Church) within a minority Community (Christian) – in today's scenario life is not an easy task. And I say this taking into consideration different aspects of our lives. In the non-religious or rather in the ordinary life scheme, this is a time of change, unlike in the previous decades, now the reality is in constant flux (like a high speed neo engine). And youth today are facing this issue constantly. The youth is caught between the old cultural value systems and its teachings on the one side and the encroaching likeness of a globalized world which includes practical everyday issues like unemployment, insecurity, migration issues, an increasing group of qualified but unskilled youth etc. There is no easy way to stay true to both. The solution they find is in the individualism and associated ideologies. These have already proved fatal for the generation in the west. But caught up in the gyre, there isn't much else to do. And on the other hand, to live as a Christian, is also becoming increasingly difficult - both in the sociopolitical world and at a very personal level. The catholic values and individualism cannot coexist which leads to an inner turmoil for many youth today.

But, inspite of all this, Indian youth, especially Catholics are blessed. A major Indian contribution to the final document is regarding the youth commissions attached to all the bishop councils in India, because of which we have a structure (though at times lacking) to hold our youth together. This is not the case in Europe and elsewhere.

Another thought which came to me during the interactions, is that though realities are very different and solutions are varied, the essential problems that youth faces everywhere is the same. Their intensity varies of course. But ultimately, a German, American, Indian, African and Columbian could sit around and relate to each other's problems though by nature they were different.

Two ideas I would like to share with FMA India on the whole, after the global interaction would be, 1) find the youth in their places. This was what Don Bosco did. But I think, with the well-established schools and colleges and institutes we have become comfortable in our rooms where a lot of youth and children come to us. But the reality is still out there. And I think a lot more can be done. 2) Talk plainly about faith and Jesus. Be courageous enough to tell the young people that living a good life as an exemplary citizen is not enough, that living the catholic life is important because that alone can assure salvation and paradise.

Although it was just 8 days, I think I can go on for 80 days and I am sure I am going to recount and retell the stories until I am 80.

But, since I cannot go on forever like that in this mail. I'll stop saying, that this presynodal journey has reinforced my faith in Christ and in God's plan for me. I bow my head before the Master Planner and though I do not know what his plans are for me, I say Vado Io. Amen



REPORT OF THE SPOKEN ENGLISH CLASS AND COMPUTER CLASS AUXILIUM CENTRE, MADURAI

"Young people, faith and vocational discernment" is the focus of Pope Francis and the whole Church during this year 2018. As we are in the initial years of our province, vocational discernment strategy has better accompaniment and discernment as its focus. So, a course on spoken English and computer class for those who would like to learn was conducted from 7th to 19th May 2018.

The Animator of the Community welcomed the five girls and Sr. Maria Joice, the Vocation Promoter and Sr. ArockiamSanthana Mary who would animate and accompany them. An apt time table with time set for English, Computer lessons and SalesianSpiritutality with moments for deep prayer experience were drawn and followed meticulously.On 7th May 2018 Smart English sessions were initiated at Auxilium Matriculation School with a short prayer and good morning given by Sr. AnthonyswamySuganthi. She orientated them and welcomed Mr. Peter the English Professor, and a Cooperator of Madurai unit to facilitate the sessions on spoken English. He was honored by the Vocation Promoter with a shawl. In the afternoon, Mr. Saravanan, teacher of Mathematics and Computer, taught Computer and its Applications in the computer Lab of Auxilium Matriculation School.



On13th May the participants went to Vadipatti - the shrine of our Lady of Velankanni. They prayed the Rosary for various intentions especially for their Public Examination results and spent an hour and returned. On the way they visited the Churches of St. Jermanina and Christ the King and prayed for all.

Faith Formation:

Sr. ArockiamSanthana Mary screened Biblical videos on Jeremiah, Joseph of Egypt, Salesian Saint. St. Joseph Cupertino which triggered the participants to follow their exemplary life and choose God and to follow Him definitely. They studied the Salesian Saints book and learnt about SalesianCharism to live their life meaningfully for a cause.

Intellectual Formation:

The spoken English class helped them to learn English in a simple way. The Master taught grammar and sentence making patiently, effectively and encouraged them lovingly and clearly by clarifying all their doubts. At the conclusion of the course the participants did their written and oral tests well. During the computer class Mr. Saravanan, taught them the basic operation of Computer, MS Word, Word Excel, Power Point Presentation, Accessories and some hardware operation. They learnt them thoroughly and presented their work efficiently.

On 19th May Sr. Devasagayam Maria Joice and Sr. Arokiasamy Santhanam along with the participants gave a short programme on what they learnt during those fifteen days. It was a new venture towards vocational accompaniment. The four girls were accompanied spiritually, emotionally and intellectually. They were strengthened in their vocation and promised to join as contact period candidates at Dindigul.

A BRIEF HISTORY:

During the concluding celebrations of Don Bosco's death centenary in 1988, some of the Tamil Nadu Bishops who were present for the function, extended their invitation to Sr. Celine Arokiaswami, the then Provincial, to open a house for youth apostolate in their dioceses. Most Rev. Dr. Sengole Lawrence Gabriel D.D, Bishop of Tiruchirapalli was one among them.

In 1993 Fr. Jude Paul Raj, the Parish Priest of Marianathapuram and brother of Sr. OphiliaArokiaswami the Animator of 'Arul Sudar', Trichy, invited the Sisters, with an understanding with the Bishop and the Diocesan Council. The first community began to serve the people of Marianathapuram from 30.04.1994, the day on whichSr. Magdalene Morano was beatified by His Holiness Pope John Paul II at Catania, Sicily. The first community Sisters were Sr.Josephine Soosaimanickam the Animator, Sr.Muthusamy Rosary and Sr. Remigious Angel Veda. They stayed in a rented house and began their apostolic mission in the parish of Marianathapuram and the surrounding villages.

SHORT DESCRIPTION OF THE WORKS OF THE INSTITUTION:

1. PARISH ANIMATION: 1994

The Parish is named after OUR LADY OF THE ASSUMPTION. Sisters are actively involved in parish animation. Given below are some of the activities carried on in the parish:

- Liturgical animation
- Teaching of Catechism.
- Preparation for First Holy Communion and Confirmation.



- Animation of the BCC Basic Christian Communities.
- Family visits
- Marriage Preparation and Settling of Marriages
- Adult Catechism

2.MARIA ANJALI DISPENSARY: 1994

The health ministry was one of the urgent needs of the people of Marianathapuram and the surrounding villages. As soon as the Sisters set their feet at Marianathapuram the healing ministry began.

Besides distribution of Medicines and caring for the sick, CHAI does a wonderful job. Since we belong to this association we are able to tap the resources to help the poor. Meetings are conducted regularly.

Training is offered to: C.H.V. (Community Health Volunteers)

Dispensary renders service to the poor of the locality. There is a laboratory to test the blood and to find out the blood group. Drips are given to the patients at a minimum cost. Per day 20 to 30 patients frequent the dispensary. It is a great blessing for the poor.

3. AUXILIUM STUDY CENTRE: 1995

Auxilium Study Centre – had its origin with few boys of the village. The study centre was inaugurated on the 22nd February 1995, with just 50 children from std I –VIII and it was called Inigo Study centre. The Centre was situated in East Marianathapuram and it catered to the children of this area. Spoken English was taught to the children asthat was the need of the hour. In 1998, the study centre became well organized and the number of children also increased to more than 200.

Around 350 children frequent the evening coaching classes and ten teachers are appointed to take care of them. Children are given snacks in order to help them study well. Spiritual animation is given importance and once a month the sacrament of Reconciliation is arranged for the children. Children are given opportunity to

take part in First Friday Mass in the Parish. The month of Rosary is kept up by reciting the Rosary. All the feasts of our Salesian family are celebrated in a grand manner.

MEAL A DAY PROGRAMME: (UNA CENA PER TUTTI)

We found that the children of Marianathapuram were weak and tired. They frequent the evening coaching and we wanted to provide them with a meal. We approached many people to help. At the end the past pupils of Liguria, Italy willingly accepted to help us. Thus began the meal a day programme. Thanks to Mrs. Rosanna Iebole who was the inspirer and the generous donor of the project.

4. WOMEN'S PROMOTION: 2000

Inauguration of:

- 1) Typewriting Course
- 2) The Needle Work and Tailoring Section with the Government aid from "*Nehru Yuva Kendra*". The Girls receive a Government Certificate at the end of this Course.

Women are empowered through skill training and placement services rendered through the Vocational training courses. Now the tying centre continues to function. Every year 50 to 60 boys and girls frequent our typing centre and appear for Government exam and come out with good results like first class and distinction.

5. EDUCATING COMMUNITY: 1996

Monthly Parents' Meet is conducted class wise at the study Centre. This is a great help for us to get to know the parents better and also to have their involvement in their children's education. We have the Core Group Meeting once in three months. The parents are given animation programmes.

The members are animated spiritually. All take part in it and give their whole hearted cooperation. Educating community is a blessing for the locality.
