My dear Sisters.

#### Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes from Tiruchirappalli.

We are about to begin the season of Lent for this year, and we have chosen to reflect on our consecrated life as an ongoing theme... these two taken together can offer us an interesting point for reflection this month: "Consecration: A daily journey of Renewal".

Our consecrated life is a gift, a call to cherish God's love and share the same to the world. Every day, we are called to renew our 'Yes' to let our hearts be shaped by Christ, to allow God's love to permeate our being, and to live out our mission as a manifestation of that love. This journey of consecration is not merely one long journey, but a dynamic, step-by-step, continually challenging call, to a constant return to the source of our calling, as a solid point of reference.

Beginning the season of Lent this month, offers us a sacred opportunity to reflect deeper on our vocation. It is a time to stand before the Lord and ask ourselves: how vibrant is my consecration? How much does my heart burn with love for God and God's people? How open am I to the Spirit of the Lord who wishes to transform me? Lent, a season of grace, is a time to rediscover the beauty of our call, to let the Spirit breathe new life into our hearts, and to embrace the continual process of becoming more and more, Christ-like.

Consecrated life is not just about what we do, it is so much about who we think we are women set apart, by God, for God, to be the living witnesses of God's presence. Yet, as the years go by, in living this call, a sense of routine could settle in, and the initial fire of our vocation could be doused by boredom or burden. The Lent is a desert that receives us, to rekindle that fire within us, helping us to get rid of what weighs us down, and make space for God to work anew within us. Jesus entered that desert not to escape but to encounter the Father closer. The same is our call this season: to embrace silence, to surrender our burdens, and to trust that in the stripping away, we are made whole. Lent is a time to return to the essence of our vocation. And how do we do it? Maybe we could adapt the following schemes!

- **PRAY** with a heart that listens deeply; listening not only to words around but to the silent voice of God within. We need to remind ourselves more that prayer is not simply a task to be completed everyday, but an encounter that takes place with the One who has called us in love.
- **FAST** from anything that weakens our fraternity, our joy, and our missionary zeal. It could be thoughts of negativity, tendency to compare, or a habit of indifference. This mode of fasting shall open the space within us, to grow in love for the Lord.
- **GIVE** not just from what we have, but from who we are; giving our presence, our kindness, our understanding, and our very being for the sake of those around us, especially who stand in need of God's closer presence.

Let us not be content in living our consecration as a duty, but let us grow in living it as a manifestation of God's love, within us and through us. Let us not permit the routine of our days, to dull the radiance of our vocation. This Lent, may we walk together, allowing the Word to guide us, encountering the Lord more intimately, nurturing relationships among us, reflecting God's love, and thus becoming living witnesses of His presence.

Lent is certainly not a season of grief; it is a happy season of return, a time to realign our hearts with the Lord. I wish to share with you a simple and inspiring meaning for LENT, that I came across. If we consider Lent as a journey towards spiritual renewal, we need to embrace the fourfold call of this sacred time - to Listen, Encounter, Nurture and Transform:

- **LISTEN to the Word:** "Harden not your hearts as at Meribah," says the Lord. Lent invites us to cultivate the habit of daily listening to God's Word, allowing it to penetrate and transform us. Listening is an act of love, a willingness to let God speak into the depths of our being and reshape us according to His will.
- **ENCOUNTER the Lord:** In Scripture, in the events of each day, in those we meet even those we struggle to love we are called to encounter Christ. True encounter is not a passing glance but a deep beholding, fostering a relationship of love and mercy. Every encounter is an opportunity to recognise Christ disguised in the ordinary moments of life.
- **NURTURE relationships:** Our God is a communion of persons the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit and we are created in that Image. Lent calls us to treasure the relationships entrusted to us, to seek reconciliation, and to build bonds of fraternity and sisterhood. In nurturing our relationships, we become visible signs of the unity and love of the Trinity, and our communities become reflections of the Reign of God.
- **TRANSFORM yourself:** The ultimate call of Lent is transformation. Conversion, repentance, return, and renewal are the gifts offered to us in this season. The Lord invites us to journey through these weeks of reflection with openness, that we may emerge renewed and ready to live our vocation with even greater love and conviction. Transformation is not instant but gradual, as grace chisels away our rough edges, shaping us into images of Christ.

May this Lent be a sacred time of Listening, Encountering, Nurturing, and Transforming. May our hearts be moulded by grace, and may our lives become fragrant offerings, manifesting the splendour of our consecration. Let us make this journey together, supporting one another as Sisters, and rejoicing in the ever-renewing love of Christ. May this season be a springtime for our souls, where every small sacrifice becomes a seed of the joy of Resurrection.

**INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY (08 March):** With a heart full of gratitude, I extend my warmest wishes to all for the International Women's Day 2025. This day is a celebration of the strength, flexibility, and grace invested in every woman to contribute to the growth of families, communities, and the world. As daughters of God, we are called to lead with wisdom, serve with love, and transform with courage, following the example of our Blessed Mother, who embraced

The message to us is that, by imitating St. Joseph, when troubles come our way and we struggle to find solutions in difficult times, we should return to the promises of the Lord. By standing on His promises, we can live our daily lives with hope, despite any uncertainties that surround us. May St. Joseph inspire us!

FEAST OF ANNUNCIATION TO OUR BLESSED MOTHER (25 March): The Feast of Annunciation is the celebration of Mary's "Yes" to God's divine plan. With profound faith and humility, she embraced her mission, becoming the Mother of the Saviour. Her response, "Let it be done to me according to Your word" (Lk 1:38), is a call for us to trust in God's will and surrender ourselves to His grace. On this sacred day, may we learn from Mary's openness, courage, and faith, saying our own "yes" to God's call in our daily lives.
