My dear Sisters,

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes from Tiruchirappalli.

As we step into this new month, we continue our reflections on the precious gift of our consecrated life, in the light of Easter. This month I would like to reflect with you on **Risen in Christ: the Call to Consecrated Witness!** The Easter joy is the very foundation of our faith, the fulfilment of God's eternal promise, and a definitive victory of light over darkness, life over death, and love over indifference. To say that *Christ is Risen* is to profess that the power of His Resurrection is alive in us, calling us to *rise*, to rise above all that keeps us bound - our fears, our insecurities, our human frailties, and our attachments to worldly concerns.

To *be risen in Christ,* is not merely a theological truth but a profound transformation of heart, mind, and spirit. As consecrated women, our lives must echo the reality of the Resurrection in the way we think, speak, act, and relate to one another. If Christ is truly risen, then we too must rise - to a new way of living, to a new way of loving, and to a new way of witnessing to the Gospel. We cannot remain in the tombs of doubt, complacency, or lukewarm faith. We are challenged to step forward with renewed zeal, embracing our vocation with joy, fidelity, and a deep sense of mission.

The call to Consecrated Witness is not just some spiritualizing concept, but a daily commitment to authenticity, integrity, and holiness. In today's world, where values are compromised, where faith is reduced to mere rituals, and where self-interest overrides the call to selfless service, our Consecrated witness is more significant than ever. Our vocation is a call to be living testimonies of Christ's Resurrection, to shine as beacons of hope in a world often clouded by despair.

Let us live with an Easter Perspective

To be risen in Christ is to see life with *Easter eyes* - eyes that recognize hope amidst suffering, light amidst darkness, and God's presence amidst the most challenging moments. It is to believe that no situation is beyond redemption, no person is beyond transformation, and no difficulty is beyond God's power to overcome. An Easter perspective does not deny the reality of struggles, but it refuses to be defeated by them. As consecrated women, we are called to cultivate this perspective in our personal lives, in our communities, and in our apostolic mission.

Let us move from Fear to Faith

Resurrection is a call to fearless living. When the Risen Christ appeared to His disciples, His first words were, "*Do not be afraid*." Fear can paralyze us - fear of the unknown, fear of failure, fear of stepping out of our comfort zones. But true discipleship demands trust, courage, and a willingness to surrender to God's plan. Are we holding ourselves back

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because of fear? Are we allowing uncertainties to dictate our choices? Resurrection invites us to place our trust in God's providence and to move forward with confidence, knowing that the Risen Lord walks with us.

Let us transform from being Passive Observers to Active Participants in Life

Resurrection is not meant to be *watched* from a distance; it is meant to be *lived*. The women at the tomb did not remain silent; they ran to proclaim the Good News. The disciples did not stay locked in fear; they went forth to preach the Gospel. Our faith cannot be passive - it must be dynamic, transformative, and contagious. As consecrated women, we need to ask ourselves: *Are we actively engaging in the mission entrusted to us? Are we willing to go beyond our routines and personal comforts to truly be instruments of Christ's hope?*

Let us shift from Selective Commitment to Total Surrender

At times, we are *choosy* in the way we respond to God's call. We choose when to be generous, whom to love, and what sacrifices to make. But when Jesus gave Himself, He did not do so partially - He gave Himself completely. As consecrated women, our response to God has to be complete and wholehearted too. Our vocation is not an entitlement, but a mission. If we have been chosen, we must embrace our chosenness with joy and above all with responsibility. The world needs radical witnesses of faith in us - women who live with passion, conviction, and a deep sense of purpose.

Let us renew our spirit of Gratitude and Joy

Consecrated witness is concretely a life of joy. Resurrection is the triumph of joy over sorrow, yet how often do we live as if burdened by life's challenges? True Christian joy is not dependent on circumstances; it is rooted in the certainty that we are loved, redeemed, and called by God. A grateful heart sees blessings even in trials and remains hopeful even in difficult moments. We are lovingly challenged to radiate the joy of Easter in our communities, ministries, and personal interactions, and enable others see in us the light of Christ's victory over sin and death!

Let us grow to be Women of Deep Faith, Love, and Service

The true mark of our consecration is not merely our religious habit or our years in the convent, but the depth of our faith, our capacity to love, and our willingness to serve. The world does not need more professionals; it needs *prophets* - women who witness to the Gospel, not just in words but in action. This requires deep prayer, desire for ongoing formation, and a daily renewal of our commitment to Christ.

Dear Sisters, Resurrection is not just a doctrine; it is the very core of our vocation. To be *Risen with Christ* is to live as *women of hope*, to proclaim through our lives that *love has conquered everything* and that *Our God lives!* Easter season is an invitation to renew our commitment, to rise from a possible spiritual slumber, and to embrace with greater zeal the mission entrusted to us. It is easy to be *silent spectators* of the glorious event of Resurrection. But the call is to be *consecrated witnesses* of God's never-failing hope, personified in Risen Lord! In being that we become living proofs that *Christus Vivit... that Christ lives -* in our hearts, in our communities, and in the world. May our lives be an unceasing *Alleluia*, a hymn of praise that resounds in everything we are involved in.

May the Risen Lord bless us and strengthen us in our journey of hope, that we grow to be Consecrated Witnesses wherever we are!
