My dear Sisters,

I wish to open this month's circular with fond and grateful prayers for Pope Francis!

With hearts full of gratitude, we remember **Pope Francis**, a shepherd after God's own heart and a Father to the world. He was indeed 'a **Pope for our times**' is words enlightened minds, and his life inspired hearts. As Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, we unite in prayer, entrusting his soul to the loving embrace of the Eternal Father. May his legacy of compassion, humility, and hope continue to guide the Church.

As we begin the month of May, the Marian month so dear to us all, our hearts naturally turn to Mary, our Mother and First Disciple. This time of the year invites us to pause, look at her again, and see in her a quiet strength, a loving heart, and a life wholly given to God. She lived simply, loved deeply, and walked faithfully in the way presented by the Father.

Continuing our reflection on consecrated life this year, Mary draws close to us in a special way. Not ahead of us like a distant figure, nor behind us just as an onlooker, Mary walks beside us, holding our hands along the path defined for us. Her self and her choices speak directly to us, of our vocation: a humble yes, a life of service, a quiet fidelity even in pain, and a heart totally open to the Spirit.

We are invited to walk closely with Mary, our Mother and Model, as we reflect on the beauty and depth of consecrated life. "With Mary, A Journey of Consecration" is more than a theme, it is a lived experience, a call to journey hand in hand with the one who first said 'yes' with courage and trust. May we allow her to speak gently to our hearts, and through her, may we hear again the Lord's invitation to a life fully consecrated to love.

1. A Hidden Life: Where God Finds Us

In the little town of Nazareth, tucked away from the eyes of the world, God found Mary. Her life was quiet, simple, and deeply rooted in Him. That's where God began the story of our salvation not in the grand or impressive phenomena, but in everyday events. There's something deeply comforting here for us. In our own hidden routines, our small acts of love, our quiet fidelity, God continues to write the story of the universe and of humanity. Following her example, we are challenged to find God in the ordinary, and let God find us there.

2. A Gentle Yes: Trusting the Unknown

Mary's "Let it be done to me" was not spoken with full understanding but it was spoken with full trust and total entrustment to the Lord. She did not ask for any guarantees or assurances. She simply made room for God's plan, even when it was mysterious and unexpected. We often find ourselves in similar situations we may have to say *yes* to things we don't fully grasp, paths we never imagined. But Mary shows us that a humble yes opens

the door to grace. As consecrated women, our trust is not in our own strength, but in the One who has called us.

3. A Love that Moves: Going in Haste to Serve

After the Annunciation, Mary didn't linger. She set off in haste to visit Elizabeth not to talk about herself, but to be of help. That quiet urgency to love, to serve, to be present it's at the heart of our Salesian vocation too. Our consecration calls us to move outward, not inward. Like Mary, we are sent not just to be noticed, but to bring Christ through our presence, our work, and our care for the young and the poor. Love doesn't sit still; it moves; it reaches out.

4. A Faith that Stays: Standing at the Cross

Mary stayed. When others fled, she remained at the foot of the Cross. She didn't speak. She didn't try to fix the pain. She simply stood there, faithful, loving, and present. In our journey, there are crosses too moments of loss, disappointment, misunderstandings, or inner struggles. Mary teaches us that sometimes the greatest act of love is simply to stay. It means to remain faithful, even when we don't understand. That's consecrated life: a love that doesn't walk away.

5. A Heart that Waits: Praying for the Spirit

After the Resurrection, we see that Mary was in the Upper Room, praying quietly with the others, waiting for the Spirit. She wasn't leading, but she was there among them making space for the Spirit to come and take over. Our mission too begins in this space of prayer. In the quiet hours before the tabernacle, in our whispered prayers, in our silent waiting the Spirit is at work. Mary teaches us that prayer isn't wasted time. It's where God shapes us for mission.

6. A Life to Imitate: Mary and Our Vocation

Mary doesn't just inspire us she helps us live our call. Her simplicity, her quiet joy, her readiness to serve all of it is woven into our Salesian way of life. She is not far from us. She is in the fabric of our very Charism, in the rhythm of our daily living. To live like Mary is not so much trying to be perfect, as it is to be available. To listen. To give what we have, even if it feels small. The way she teaches us is a daily yes, a deep joy, and a love that keeps going.

7. A Spirit to Renew Us: Consecrated with Mary's Heart

As we honour our Blessed Mother, She gently invites us to renew our 'yes' not in grand gestures, but in simple faithfulness. She shows us how to listen again to God's voice, how to serve with joy, how to remain rooted in prayer. Consecrated life isn't about being extraordinary. It's about being completely given. That's what Mary teaches us. And in her company, we find the strength to begin again, to love more freely, to give ourselves more fully.

With Mary... Towards the Heart of God

Mary walks with us side by side. She reminds us that a life fully offered is a life deeply blessed. She shows us that joy and suffering, action and prayer, visibility and hiddenness

all belong in the journey of consecration. So, in this month of our Blessed Mother, let us allow her to draw us closer to the Heart of Christ. May our lives like hers be a heart-filled hymn of love, sung not in words, but in our way of life, the way we live our consecrated lives.

Born into simplicity and humility, Mary Mazzarello grew to embody the heart of a true disciple: joyful, hardworking, and deeply rooted in faith. Her feast on 13 May draws us deeper into the mystery of her holiness.
