My dear Sisters,

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes from Tiruchirappalli.

For the past two years, through our monthly reflections, we have been gradually journeying towards the inner core of our vocation - the first year contemplating the beauty and challenge of community life and the following year reflecting on the gift of our consecrated way of life. This year, we turn our gaze outward, or onward, focusing on the richness of our Salesian charism and the apostolic mission entrusted to us as Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. Each month of this year shall offer us an opportunity to reflect on our mission, inspired progressively by the articles from our Constitution on “Our Mission” (Articles 63 to 76). We begin this journey of comprehending our mission, at its source: the Heart of Christ, the wellspring of our mission.

The Sacred Heart of Christ: The Wellspring of Our Salesian Mission

Article 63: Sharing in the salvific mission of Christ, the Good Shepherd

“Our mission comes from the saving initiative of the Father... to share in the prophetic, priestly, and kingly ministry of Christ, by witnessing, proclaiming the Word, and rejoicing in salvation.” (*Constitutions, Art. 63*)

The month of June calls us to fix our gaze upon the Sacred Heart of Jesus - not a symbol of mere sentiment, but of the loving fidelity of God to the Covenant. For us Salesian Sisters, the Heart of Christ is not only an object of devotion, but the fountain of our apostolic passion. From this Heart, spring our identity, our charism, and above all, the mission entrusted to us by God.

Article 63, beginning the section on our mission, establishes right at the outset, the crux of our mission, with these phrases: “preferential love for young”, “signs and mediations of the love of Christ”, “Christian education of the whole person” etc., making us aware of the primacy of love, that saving love symbolised by the Sacred Heart. Following this Sacred Heart, we are called to develop a heart after the Shepherd, a heart that exhibits the following qualities.

A Prophetic Heart - Discerning God’s Voice Today:

To be prophetic is to read the signs of the times through the eyes of the Gospel. Jesus’ Heart burned with prophetic compassion. He felt the suffering of the other, challenged injustice, and brought hope to the hopeless. As FMA, our prophetic mission means being attentive to the cries of the other, beginning with those living with us and extending to the

young people we are sent to serve, especially those wounded by loneliness, neglect, or isolation of all kinds. We are called to offer them spaces of listening, belonging, and healing. Like Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello, our presence among the young should proclaim to them: God sees you, God loves you, God believes in you!

A Priestly Heart - Offering Ourselves in Love:

The priestly dimension of our mission invites us to be women of communion, intercession, and spiritual accompaniment. Jesus' Heart is a symbol of total self-offering - the paschal sacrifice on the Cross, the self-giving in the Eucharist, and the continuous presence as a daily act of love. When we pray with and for the young, when we offer our fatigue with joy, when we silently forgive or gently correct, we participate in Christ's priestly love. With the young, we are called not only to pray, but beyond that, to become prayer - through our lives lived in union with God and in service to God's little ones.

A Kingly Heart - Reaching out with Authority:

Christ the King governs, He rules not with force, but with the washbowl and the waist cloth! The leadership that His Heart teaches us is rooted in humility, justice, compassion and service. The article calls us to be "signs and mediations of the love of the Good Shepherd." Whether as animators, teachers, or catechists, we are invited to form the young by empowering them. Our corrections become gestures of love, our education becomes a mission of hope, and our leadership becomes a manifestation of our maternal wisdom.

A Marian Heart - Mediating God's Tenderness:

Mary, the first disciple and Help of Christians, offers us the model of a missionary heart rooted in contemplation and service. Her heart was united with that of her Son - attuned to God's will and sensitive to human need. With her heart, we learn to 'see' the needs of the other before they are spoken. Like her, we are called to be mediators, bringing Jesus to others through our presence, word, and prayer. In Mary, we find the strength to remain faithful even in darkness and to say "yes" daily to the mission entrusted to us.

A Shepherd's Heart - Pedagogy of the Preventive System:

The Sacred Heart shaped the educational prodigy of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello. They did not love the young in theory, they loved them concretely, patiently, joyfully. Their hearts overflowed with pastoral charity. Living the Preventive System today means offering a Salesian presence that is joyful, relational and holy. In a world of brokenness, our style of accompaniment has to heal, uplift and inspire. When we truly love the young as our holy founders did with tenderness and firmness, joy and reason, they shall see the heart of the Divine Shepherd in us.

A Missionary Heart - Going forth joyfully with Fire:

The Sacred Heart sends us *Caritas Christi urget nos*. As our beloved late Holy Father Pope Francis was fond of saying, our mission is to go forth. It is a call to reach out to the peripheries - the hideouts of the suffering, those with doubts, and those who are in search. It invites us to be "credible signs" of the Good Shepherd, who goes forth in search of the lost. Today, this dimension of the mission means a lot, as we are called to be present in the digital world, where the young people are found searching for meaning, in order that we

could offer them the joy of the Gospel. Being bearers of a living encounter with Christ, every courtyard, corridor, or classroom transforms itself into a mission field. The article also reminds us that our mission is fundamentally, our joy. The joy that we radiate as individuals and as communities is our principal mission. When we live with joy, we proclaim that God is with us, even amidst our trials. Our joy becomes evangelising. In a world that sulks in its self-inflicted burdens, a simple and holy joy of a Sister can stand out as a powerful proclamation of God's everlasting love.

Beholding our mission from the Heart of Christ...

Dear Sisters, as we begin to reflect on our charism in this continuing Jubilee Year of Hope, let us joyfully and constantly return to the Heart of Christ. In prayer, in sisterly life shared, and in our mission, may we allow the love of God to shape our being and our doing. Let us never forget that we are called to be women of prophetic insight, priestly compassion, and kingly service. Let us imitate the Heart of Mary and rekindle within our hearts the missionary fire of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello. From the Heart of the Shepherd, our mission is born, and in His Heart, our hearts are set aflame.

May this month dedicated to the Sacred Heart, renew in each of us the joy of our vocation and the fire of our mission. May we proclaim with our lives: *"I have found the one my heart loves"* (Song of Songs 3:4), and I will serve Him by loving the young entrusted to me, until my last breath!

- **THANKING GOD FOR THE NEW POPE:** With profound gratitude, we praise God for the gift of our new Pope. Leo XIV, the new shepherd chosen according to God's wisdom and love, on 08 May 2025. In the unfolding mystery of God's providence, we see once again that God never ceases to guide the Church with care and fidelity. We stand in awe of the Spirit's silent work, moving through time and hearts to raise up a leader for this new chapter in the life of the Church. Our hearts overflow with love and joyful hope as we welcome our Holy Father, and pledge him our prayerful support, filial affection, and steadfast unity. May our new Holy Father be strengthened with grace, wisdom, and courage as he carries the mantle of Peter to feed, to guide, and to unite the flock of Christ. Long live Pope Leo XIV.
- **59TH WORLD DAY OF SOCIAL COMMUNICATIONS 2025 (JUNE 01):** The Mother Church marks the 59th World Day of Social Communications with the theme: "Share with gentleness the hope that is in your hearts." In a time of widespread disinformation and polarization, Pope Francis urges us to "disarm" communication, that is, freeing it from aggression and restoring dialogue rooted in truth and compassion. "All conflicts start when individual faces melt away and disappear," he reminds us true communication begins by recognizing the other as a person, not an opponent. As Salesian educators and missionaries, we are called to form the young in a culture of gentleness, empathy, and Gospel-centered communication. Let us begin with offering a model of respectful dialogue in our communities... in our day-to-day relationships

among us, becoming authentic communicators of hope especially to the young and marginalized.

- **FEAST OF PENTECOST (JUNE 08):** The Solemnity of the Pentecost, 08 June 2025, reminds us of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that gave birth to the Church and continues to renew the face of the earth. For us Consecrated persons, this is a sacred moment to rekindle our total surrender to Christ and rediscover the transforming power of the Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit who shapes us into faithful disciples, strengthens our vows, and empowers us to live with joy, courage, and fidelity. As He did in the Upper Room, the Spirit descends upon our communities today, igniting our hearts with zeal, deepening our communion, and sending us forth to be radiant witnesses of Christ's love in a world longing for light and hope. Let us seek the grace to be docile to the promptings of the Spirit, bearing fruits and living totally for Christ, who has called us to be His own.
- **EIGHTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ERECTION OF THE PROVINCE (JUNE 10):** On June 10, we gratefully commemorate the eighth anniversary of the erection of our Province, a milestone that invites us to pause, reflect and renew our missionary ardour. Born under the maternal mantle of Our Lady of Snow, our Province was inspired with the prophetic vision: to read the signs of the time and respond with faith, creativity, and pastoral charity. Over these years, we have journeyed together in deepening communion, faithful to the Salesian charism of Don Bosco and St. Mary Mazzarello, offering hope to the young and the poor. Today, more than ever, we are called to go forth with courage and compassion to the peripheries of our society, responding especially to the cries of young people and the marginalized - those who long for accompaniment, meaning, and love.

Let us mark this day in our communities with a special moment of prayer and an act of consecration, entrusting our Province once again to the loving care of Our Lady of Snow. May Our Lady of Snow, continue to protect, guide, and inspire our Province!

- **FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY (JUNE 15):** The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity invites us, as religious sisters, to contemplate and imitate the perfect communion of love shared by the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In the Trinity, we see a model of unity in diversity, a call to live in harmony while embracing each sister's uniqueness. Just as the Father loves, the Son serves, and the Spirit empowers, we too are called to love unconditionally, serve joyfully, and live in the Spirit's guidance. May our consecrated life reflect this divine communion, becoming a visible sign of God's presence and love in the world.
- **THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (JUNE 22):** The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is a profound reminder of Christ's total self-gift in the Eucharist a love that nourishes, heals, and unites. - **ANNUAL RETREAT III:** Forty-five Sisters participated in the third Annual Retreat from 03 to 10 May 2025 at Don Bosco Wellington preached by Rev. Fr. Mathias Partrick DB. The theme was on "Seek me and live (Amos 5:4) - Formula for holiness".
