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My dear Sisters,

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes to you ...

“Co-workers in the Mission: Living the Apostolic Mandate Together”

As we step into a new month, I would like to invite you all to revisit a key element of our spiritual and apostolic identity - our shared mission as Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. This reflection centers on Article 64 of our Constitutions, a passage that is not merely juridical but profoundly charismatic and ecclesial. This article affirms:

“The Apostolic mandate is entrusted by the Church to the Institute that implements it through the province and local communities in communion with the local Churches and participating in their evangelizing activities. By the very fact of being a member of a specific community, every Daughter of Mary Help of Christians is commissioned.” (Art. 64)

Let us listen deeply with the ears of our vocation to what this moment invites us to live in our personal mission, community life, and response to the needs of the young.

The Apostolic Mandate - A Gift and a Responsibility

The apostolic mandate is not something external or optional. It is the very reason for our existence as an institute. When the Church entrusts a mission to a religious family, she confers a sacred trust: to make Christ present in a specific way, to a specific people in our case, the young, especially the poor and most in need.

Unlike a job assignment or career path, the apostolic mandate comes from the heart of the Church. It is exercised in and through community, and it is inseparable from our Salesian identity. This mandate is carried out through the province and local communities, meaning the mission is not fulfilled by individuals alone, but collectively, as a united whole. Each province becomes a local expression of the Church's apostolic desire, and each community becomes a missionary community where the Gospel is lived, shared, and witnessed.

Let us recall the small community of Mornese - few in number, yet rich in missionary zeal. Each Sister, whatever her role, shared one vision: to save souls, especially the young. When we see our communities not merely as places of residence but as true missionary spaces, we turn ordinary ground into sacred places where young lives are transformed.

“Every Sister is commissioned” - The Mission is Personal

Article 64 beautifully reminds us that by the very fact of being a member of a specific community, every Daughter of Mary Help of Christians is already commissioned. This is a profound and liberating truth: our mission doesn't begin with a role or assignment, it begins with our profession and the daily witness of our presence. Whether we are novices or elderly Sisters, formators or community animators, in classroom, kitchen, or chapel, our entire life is apostolic.

There's a touching story from the life of Mother Mazzarello that speaks volumes. One day, a young Sister shared her sadness at not being given a visible role like teaching or leading youth groups. With her usual gentleness, Mother Mazzarello smiled and said, "*Dear daughter, do you not realize that by being among your Sisters and doing your tasks well, with love, you are already building the Kingdom of God?*"

In today's world, where recognition and achievement are often seen as measures of worth, her words are a powerful reminder: faithfulness in hidden, humble tasks is just as apostolic as preaching or teaching.

Community life is not a distraction from mission - it is its very foundation. Even our moments of frailty, silence, and simple service carry deep missionary value. A single act of love, offered quietly and faithfully, becomes a blessing for the whole Church.

Living the Spirit of Don Bosco: "Da Mihi Animas"

The heart of our apostolic spirituality is beautifully captured in Don Bosco's motto: "Da mihi animas, caetera tolle" - "Give me souls, take away the rest." This was not a mere slogan; it was the daily heartbeat of his life, a deep longing to bring every young person to Christ.

One evening in Valdocco, Don Bosco saw a boy stealing bread. Instead of reacting with anger, he gently asked, "Why are you doing this?" The boy answered, "I'm hungry and nobody cares." Don Bosco didn't judge him. He gave him food, offered him work, and restored his dignity. From this simple act of compassion sprang a revolution in education, one built not on punishment, but on understanding; not on rejection, but on redemption.

As Salesian women, we are not just educators - we are co-redeemers, instruments of God's mercy. Whether in the classroom, the courtyard, the refectory, or the infirmary, every space becomes an altar of encounter. When we live our mission with this zeal for souls, we are no longer defined by what we do, but by the fire that burns within us. Don Bosco reminds us that the young must not only be loved, they must know they are loved. This is our apostolic programme. This is our way of holiness.

Mother Mazzarello: A Model of Apostolic Fidelity

Mother Mazzarello's life is a testament to how even suffering and limitation can become apostolic. After falling ill with typhoid, she could no longer work in the fields. She was devastated. But rather than give in to despair, she asked, "What does God want of me now?" And so began a new mission: forming girls in virtue, in skill, and in faith. Her little sewing room became a school of holiness.

She once said, "Do good, but do it well... and do it cheerfully." Her apostolic fervor was not limited to her energy. It flowed from her union with God and her charity toward others. Even when she became Superior General, she never ceased being a mother, a sister, and a friend to each one. Every letter she wrote carried apostolic wisdom simple, yet profound. "Be cheerful, the devil is afraid of joyful souls." "Work always in union with the others." "Let your love for the girls be tender, but strong." In her, we see a woman who truly lived her mission, not with grand gestures, but with heroic daily faithfulness. She lived Article 64 before it was ever written.

Apostolic Identity in Community: Unity in Diversity

The article calls us to live our identity as Salesian educators in communion, each fulfilling different but complementary roles in the spirit of "*Da mihi animas...*" This unity is vital - our apostolic witness loses strength when our community life lacks harmony. In Mornese, when one Sister fell ill, another quietly took her night duty. The girl they cared for later became a catechist, saying, "*It wasn't your words - it was your joy that made me believe in God.*" When we live in communion,

we preach without words. By valuing each Sister's role, however simple, we reveal the Body of Christ united, joyful, and forgiving. This is the Gospel lived in community.

A Mission of Hope: In Light of the Jubilee Year

As we journey toward the Jubilee of 2025 with the theme "*Spes non confundit*" ("Hope does not disappoint"), we are reminded that our mission is also a mission of hope. Today's young people face deep anxiety, brokenness, and despair. We are called to be pilgrims of hope, bringing Christ's light into their darkness. Pope Francis urged consecrated persons to be islands of mercy, bridges of reconciliation, and witnesses of resurrection. Hope is not wishful thinking, it is the certainty that in Christ, no one is ever truly lost. When we listen, smile, or accompany with love, we become signs of hope. Like Mary, may we carry Christ to every heart, every place, and every moment entrusted to us.

To reflect

Article 64 calls us to remember our shared responsibility, personal commitment, and common identity. It invites each of us to reflect: "*How am I living my mission today?*" "*Am I a woman of communion?*" "*Do I carry an apostolic fire in my daily life?*"

Like Don Bosco, may we burn with zeal for souls. Like St. Mary Mazzarello, may we radiate humility, joy, and simplicity. Like Mary Help of Christians, may we be gentle, faithful, and strong in love. Let us walk this mission together, hand in hand, heart to heart - knowing that Christ sends us, the Church trusts us, and the young are waiting.

ST. THOMAS - THE APOSTLE OF INDIA (03 July): St. Thomas the Apostle, often remembered for his doubt, offers a powerful testimony of sincere faith. When Jesus appeared and invited him to believe, Thomas responded with one of the most profound declarations in Scripture: "My Lord and my God!" His journey reminds us that questioning can be a path to deeper belief and that true faith is not blind, but grounded in a personal relationship with the living Christ.

On this special day, heartfelt wishes to all the members of the SDBs and FMAs of the INM Province of St. Thomas, the Apostle as they celebrate their Patron Saint. May his example inspire renewed faith, unity, and missionary passion in every community.

BLESSED MARIA ROMERO MENESES: On 07 July, we commemorate Blessed Maria Romero Meneses, FMA, a shining example of Salesian holiness and social commitment. Her life was marked by profound trust in Mary Help of Christians and a courageous dedication to uplifting the poor and marginalized. With a heart full of compassion, she became a bridge between the rich and the poor, creating works of charity that reflected God's tender love. ST. ALPHONSA MUTTATHUPADATHU (22 July): St. Alphonsa Muttathupadathu, the first woman of Indian origin to be canonized, shines as a model of humility, patience, and joyful acceptance of suffering. Through her silent sacrifice and deep union with Christ in the midst of pain, she teaches us the power of redemptive suffering offered with love. St. Alphonsa's gentle life reminds us that holiness can be found in simple, hidden deeds done with great love. On her

feast, may we be inspired to embrace our daily crosses with courage, trusting that God's grace transforms even our trials into blessings for the world.

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY (27 July): The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated on Sunday, 27 July 2025, as announced by the Catholic Grandparents Association. - **TEAM AND COMMISSION MEET:** The meeting of the Provincial Team and the Province Commission Members was held on 14 June 2025 at Auxilium Provincial House, Tiruchirappalli, with the aim of evaluating the past year's journey and collaboratively planning

for the new academic year. To set the tone for the day, I initiated the gathering with a talk on 'Team Building'. Sector coordinators presented their Annual Plans and Projects, and the Annual Calendar was reviewed and updated. On this occasion, Sr. Peter Selvarani was gratefully acknowledged for her seven years of service as General Coordinator, while Sr. Rayan M. Auxilia Sophi was warmly welcomed as the new General Coordinator, along with the newly inducted team members. Annual Reports from the various sectors were shared, highlighting achievements and challenges. In the afternoon, participants visited the Team Room to update files with reports and photos, ensuring proper documentation. A joint discussion between team and commission members focused on key areas for growth. The General Assembly offered a moment of collective reflection and renewed commitment to the Province's mission. The presence of five lay collaborators enriched the discussions with fresh perspectives. The day concluded with tea and a spirit of collaboration and dedication.

The Province Economist shared practical strategies for sound financial and administrative management, equipping animators for responsible and effective stewardship.
- **COURSE ON JOURNAL WRITING:** The training course on Journal Writing was held on 21 and 22 June 2025 at Auxilium Provincial House, Tiruchirappalli. Sincere Thanks to the animators who sent not only the sisters responsible for the Community Chronicles but also few more sisters eager to strengthen their writing skills. A total of 34 sisters from across the communities participated in this enriching formation session. Rev. Fr. M.A. Joe Antony, S.J. systematically guided the participants, encouraging them to have a love for writing and an appreciation for its value. Through practical workshops, he taught the essential elements of writing reports, magazine articles, profiles, and biographies. I wish that this significant initiative may further enhance the quality of documentation in our communities, enabling us to preserve and communicate the progressive history of the Province with greater clarity, depth, and professionalism.
- **NEW ECONOMERS' MEET:** The newly appointed Economers of our Province gathered for a two-day meeting on 26 and 27 June 2025 at Auxilium Provincial House. The sessions, organized by Sr. Madalaimuthu Angela, Provincial Economist, aimed at guiding and equipping the new Economers with essential knowledge and skills in financial management, helping them carry out their responsibilities with confidence and competence.
- **GLOBAL COMPACT ON EDUCATION - ONLINE MEETING:** An online session on the Global Compact on Education was organized for all the Sisters on 25 June 2025, from 06.00 p.m. to 07.30 p.m. The session was led by Rev. Fr. John Parankimalil, SDB, who served as the resource person for this enriching and informative webinar. Fr. John clearly and effectively explained the seven key principles of the Global Compact on Education. His presentation was both inspiring and practical, offering concrete suggestions on how to implement these principles in our daily lives and educational missions. The session was highly appreciated by the participants for its clarity, depth, and practical relevance.
- **SOUTH ASIA ACSSA REGIONAL SEMINAR:** Sr. Antony Lourdu Sagayam, Sr. Anthony Rayappan Jothy, Sr. Mahimai Raj Jaya Sharmila, and Sr. Sundaram Bernadette Neha took part in the South Asia ACSSA Regional Seminar, held from 27 to 29 June 2025 at
