Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes to you...

As we continue our journey of deepening the understanding of our charism and mission as Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, the month of August shines before us as a truly blessed moment of grace. It is a time to pause, look back with hearts full of gratitude, and step forward with renewed zeal and purpose. This month carries a special significance as we joyfully celebrate the birthday of our beloved Institute on 05 August, a day that calls us to return to our roots and rekindle the fire of our vocation to be authentic Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. Adding even more joy, this cherished date is also the feast of our Province, lovingly placed under the tender protection of Our Lady of the Snow. What a beautiful invitation to celebrate our identity, our history, and the mission entrusted to us!

If we were to ask ourselves what stirred in the hearts of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello when they founded our Institute, the answer would be clear: a profound predilection for the young, especially those who are poorest, most vulnerable, and most in need. This founding charism comes alive with striking clarity in Article 65 of our Constitutions, the focus of our reflection this month. It challenges us to go beyond simply doing things for the young; it calls us to give ourselves wholly to them. At the heart of this mission is presence, walking alongside the young, sharing their joys and struggles, and being a living sign of God's love through the ministry of accompaniment.

Walking with the young: Our Mission of Accompaniment

"With the preferential love of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello, we dedicate ourselves to the poorest, that is, to those who, ... have the least chance of success in life and are more exposed to danger..." Art. 65

Salesian Mission as Walking Beside the Young

To accompany is not to walk ahead, nor to walk behind, but to **walk beside**. It is a ministry of proximity, patience and presence.

In today's world, young people face countless visible and invisible challenges:

- Choices made in adolescence that affect their entire future
- Confusion regarding identity, meaning, and values
- Loneliness, even in hyper-connected digital spaces
- Lack of reliable adults who listen with empathy and guide without judgment.

In this context, our Salesian mission is not primarily about organizing grand programmes or numerous activities. Rather, it is about cultivating secure and sacred spaces where young people feel seen, valued, loved, listened to, and gently guided. Mother Mazzarello modelled this beautifully through her loving vigilance and constant presence among the young girls. Her style of accompaniment was marked by a quiet strength, being present, attentive, and available without overwhelming, yet never indifferent.

Article 65 invites us to walk beside the young, not as a generic act of service, but as a conscious and loving choice that expresses our preferential option for the poorest. Poverty, as the article reminds us, is not limited to material lack. It includes all those "who have the least chance of success in life" and those more exposed to danger. In our Indian context today, this would encompass the young girls forced to drop out of school, the youth trapped in online addictions or substance abuse, and adolescents from broken homes or emotionally vulnerable families. Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello founded our Institute for precisely these young lives. Their love was never abstract or sentimental, it was concrete, radical, and deeply attuned to the real struggles of the time. This preferential love is not an added option or an occasional focus, it is the very reason for our being FMA.

Accompaniment - the Art of Walking With the Young

Allow me to offer you a few simple points of reflection that would summarise the nature of our mission as accompaniment:

- Are we too focused on organizing events, rather than being unconditionally available to the young we meet each day? **The call to shift from Programmes to Presence!**
- Do we truly listen to the young, with a desire to understand their hearts, or do we quickly jump in with advice, even if well-meant? **The challenge to shift from Lecturing to Listening!**
- Do we radiate the Salesian warmth that invites the young to approach us freely, or have we unknowingly built invisible walls? The need to shift from Formality to Familiarity! (Or, from Distance to Dialogue!)
- Do we evaluate our mission by how much we've done, or by how deeply we've touched lives? The need to shift our focus from Results to Relationships!

Let these not become rhetoric questions. They invite each of us, our communities, our institutions, our homes, boardings and hostels, and our oratories, to check the quality of the Salesian presence.

Accompaniment with Hope - Our Mission Today

We know well, walking with the young is not a new method or a novel idea; it is the very heart of our Salesian mission and the root of our Salesian charism. We are living today a heritage of more than 150 years, which calls us to listen to the young, to walk alongside them with patience, and to help them discover God's design for them. Our mission today must respond to the real situations that young people face, with all the confusion and challenges that crowd their lives. When we walk with them, we do not drag them by force but orient them by our gentle presence, convinced about their potential and trusting in God's ongoing work within them. Pope Francis reminded us often: *Young people need to be accompanied, not pushed.*

Our accompaniment today needs to extend itself into the digital spaces, where young people seem to be frenetically searching for meaning in life and for a sense of belonging. How can we offer them guidance, even here, while remaining faithful to our Salesian charism?

Salesian Charism - A Mission Rooted in Joy and Fidelity

Our daily joy and constant fidelity, which are the hallmark of our charism, could become a guiding compass to our young friends. As we celebrate the feast of *Our Lady of the Snow* this August, we are reminded of Mary's quiet, loving, and courageous presence, whether walking beside Jesus or standing by the early Church. In her, we find a perfect model of accompaniment.

Mary teaches us three essential attitudes for walking with the young:

- 1. **Listening without Judging** as at Cana, where she simply noticed that "they have no wine."
- 2. **Guiding without Forcing** as with Jesus in the temple, where she allowed Him the space yet kept Him in her heart.
- 3. **Going all the Way** as at Calvary, where she stood by the Cross, even when everything seemed dark and lost.

May this month, filled with memories of our charism and mission, rekindle in us the same fire that was aflame in Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello, a fire that never grows old because it is constantly rekindled by the agonising cry of the young and the compassionate love of God.

With Mary Help of Christians, may we continue to walk, listen, and accompany our young with joy and fidelity.

• A GRACE-FILLED JUBILEE OF FAITHFUL LOVE: The Golden Jubilee celebration of the Religious Profession of our dear Sisters Sr. Aruldoss Rose Mary and Sr. Pushpanathan Virginia took place on 05 July 2025 at Auxilium Provincial House, Tiruchirappalli. It was a beautiful and grace-filled day of thanksgiving, where the entire Province gathered as one family to thank God for the gift of their 50 years of faithful, joyful, and fruitful religious commitment.

A special word of gratitude goes to our Vice Provincial, whose dedicated and meticulous follow-up ensured that every detail was thoughtfully arranged, allowing the celebration to unfold smoothly and meaningfully. I also extend my sincere thanks to the Councillors, the Animators of all participating communities, the staff and students, and every sister who, both visibly and behind the scenes, contributed so generously to making this Jubilee a truly grand and memorable occasion.

- INM & INT FORMATORS' MEET: The Formators' meeting held on 14 July 2025 at Kodambakkam, Chennai, offered a meaningful space for mutual sharing, reflection, and planning the formative journey of our Sisters. Sr. Devadoss Margaret, Provincial of INM, spoke on accompaniment as a sacred encounter between God and the called, drawing inspiration from the Gospel and the FMA Constitutions. Sr. Susai Josephine Rani, INM Province Secretary, introduced the newly published commentary on the FMA Constitutions, *Le Costituzioni delle FMA: un cammino di santità nel quotidiano*, released in preparation for the 150th anniversary of the first missionary departure. A translated passage was shared for personal reflection. In the concluding message, I shared a reflection comparing the process of formation to "the growth of a bamboo grove: silent, steady, and deeply rooted," reminding ourselves of the task of the Formators to nurture hidden growth with patience, resilience, and grace.
- YOUNG AT RISK AND NON-FORMAL COORDINATORS MEET: On 09 July 2025, the Young at Risk (YaR) and Non-Formal Coordinators Meet was held at George Town Marialaya, organized by Sr. Remegius Angel Veda, YaR and Non-Formal Coordinator. There were 13 Sisters and 10 lay coordinators participated in it. Sr. Micheal Arokia Sujatha Mary, Animator of GT Marialaya, inspired the participants with a talk on "Pilgrims of Hope." Sr. Joseph Prettencia, Assistant Directress of ASSIST, conducted a session on stress management and personal growth using the Silva Mind Method. Sr. Azarius Arockia Mary Selvi, Directress of ASSIST, shared insights on the Neighborhood Children Parliament, focusing on fostering child leadership. Local Coordinators presented their annual reports and together planned initiatives for 2025 2026.
- WOMEN DEVELOPMENT COORDINATORS' MEET: On 10 July 2025, George Town Marialaya, Chennai hosted the Women Development Coordinators Meet with 10 Sisters and 12 women from eight communities. Sr. Antony Lourdu Sagayam, Province Women Coordinator, and Sr. Azarias Arockia Mary Selvi, Province Councillor for Social Development, led the gathering to strengthen the women's network and enhance income-generating initiatives for better economic stability. The day began with a keynote on "Sustainable Pathways for Women Empowerment" and continued with interactive discussions. The Co-ordinators shared their annual reports, highlighting their successes and challenges as Self-Help Group members. The meet ended with a concrete action plan for 2025 2026.
- YOUTH PASTORAL COORDINATORS' MEET: The Youth Pastoral Coordinators' Meeting was held on 12 July 2025 at Auxilium Convent, Puthenthurai, organized by Sr. John Bosco Edal Queen, Province Youth Pastoral Coordinator, with 20 FMA Local Youth Pastoral Coordinators participating. I was present for the meeting along with Sr. Lazar Bernadine, the Vice Provincial. My initial talk on "the role of the youth animators" set the tone of the day. Sr. Edal Queen presented key insights from the General Councillor for Youth Pastoral, Sr. Runita Borgia, on "accompaniment, responsibilities of coordinators, and vocational promotion". Through creative group activities like role plays and skits, participants reflected on their mission and also planned the Annual Youth Calendar, formation of a province-level youth group, and the upcoming Provincial Youth Fest.

• **PSYCHO-SPIRITUAL INTEGRATION COURSE:** The Psycho-Spiritual Integration Course for the Sisters of the Province was conducted at the Auxilium Provincial House, Tiruchirappalli. The sessions were animated by Rev. Fr. Joye James, SJ, a well-known Jesuit spiritual guide and counselor, who brought his vast experience in accompaniment and psycho-spiritual formation to enrich the participants.

The course aimed to offer a possibility for the Sisters to reflect on their life journey, integrate their spiritual and emotional experiences, and deepen their sense of identity and vocation. The participants were divided into three batches based on their years of religious profession, ensuring a more focused and relevant experience for each group.

Batch I (16 - 17 July 2025) included 41 young and vibrant Sisters professed between 2010 and 2025;

Batch II (19 - 20 July 2025) brought together 44 Sisters professed between 1992 and 2009; and

Batch III (22 - 23 July 2025) consisted of 33 Sisters, professed between 1973 and 1991.

In these meetings, Fr. Joye James, SJ, through his holistic and compassionate approach, created a space of trust and depth, allowing participants to journey inward with courage and openness. The sessions fostered healing, renewal, and a deeper integration of their psycho-spiritual self with their identity as Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. The course was truly a moment of grace, reminding all that religious life is a continuous journey of becoming, emotionally whole, spiritually grounded, and joyfully committed. The Province expresses its heartfelt gratitude to Rev. Fr. Joye James, SJ, for his enriching guidance and to all the Sisters who participated with openness and enthusiasm.

• POSTULANTS' AND ASPIRANTS RETREAT AND MEDALING CEREMONY: Rev. Fr. Periyanayagam Christhuraj SDB preached the spiritual retreat for the Aspirants and Postulants was held from 21 to 23 July 2025 at Sacred Heart Home, Katpadi. Sr. Lazar Bernardine, the Vice Provincial, and I had the joy of being present for the occasion of the Postulants' Medaling Ceremony on 24 July 2025. Twelve new Postulants received their medals, marking a significant step in their journey toward religious life: five from the INT Province, who received their medals from the INT Provincial, and seven from the INM Province, who received theirs from the INM Provincial.

The day was made even more special with the initiation of new Aspirants into the Aspirantate. Let us pray that these young women, strengthened by the inspiration of Don Bosco, St. Mary Mazzarello, and the loving guidance of Mother Mary, may embrace their formative journey with renewed faith, joy, and commitment.

• INM & INT JUNIORS TRIMONTHLY RECOLLECTION: The Junior Sisters of the INM and INT Provinces participated in the Tri-monthly Recollection and Animation Program held on 26 and 27 July 2025 at Kodambakkam. Rev. Fr. Sathian OFM, professor at Anugraha, Dindigul, animated the sessions on *Positive Psychology*, emphasizing emotional well-being, balanced living, altruism, and inner healing through practical meditation techniques. The recollection coincided with the feast of

St. Joachim and St. Anne, marked by prayerful remembrance of grandparents and elderly Sisters. On the Animation day Sr. Devadoss Margaret, INM Provincial, animated the group on the *FMA Constitutions*, focusing on mission-related articles and encouraging reflection in profession batches. The Sisters also presented the *Cronistoria* and the *Pact of the Covenant with God*, followed by moments of joyful recreation and community bonding.

• **ISS-FMA INDIA MEET - GUWAHATI:** Sr. Masilamani Sebasti Jeya Pushpam and Sr. Vedamuthu Savariammal represented our Province at the ISS-FMA India Meet held from 24 - 29 July 2025 at Auxilium Reach Out, Guwahati. It served as a platform for reflection, strategic planning, and collaboration, reaffirming the commitment to build institutions that are spiritually grounded, socially responsive, and technologically equipped for the holistic development of the young, in the spirit of synodality and the Salesian charism.
