My dear Sisters

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes to each one of you.

Our hearts filled with gratitude, we lift our voices in praise to God for the gift of a new Saint, **St. Maria Troncatti**, our own sister, whose Salesian missionary heart blazed with the fire of the Gospel. The canonization, held at St. Peter's Square on **19 October 2025**, was a moment of immense joy for the entire Salesian Family and for the Church. As one of our own was raised to the Altars, the event became a living reminder of the countless missionaries both past and present, who have been and who continue to be instruments sowing seeds of love, faith, and hope in distant lands amid difficult circumstances. Truly, our Institute is blessed with a legacy written not just in books, but through the lives of women who have loved God and God's people up unto the end.

As we step into the month of November, we turn our grateful gaze towards these courageous Sisters who work quietly in remote corners of the world, often without recognition, but never lacking in their radiant joy. Their lives remind us that *mission is not just about going far away; it is about drawing near, near to God, near to one another, and near to the hearts of the young.*

This month, we propose to ourselves Art No. 68 of our Constitutions for reflection: "**The educating community**". We are reminded of the crucial role that the educating community plays in "ensuring the unity and continuity of all formative interventions within the one educational plan".

1. Communion as Mission

It is not merely that our mission is carried out in communion, but communion in itself is our first mission. Article 68 of our Constitutions reminds us that the educating community is the first mission field entrusted to us. An *educating community* is not merely a structure or a system; it is a living communion of hearts created by the passion we share for the young. Like a mosaic, it shines in its entirety when every piece is in place! The community becomes missionary when it breathes harmony. When Sisters, teachers, parents, and students together create an atmosphere where love is felt, faith is nurtured, and goodness grows naturally, there is communion that flourishes.

Sr. Maria Troncatti, our recent saint, teaches us that communion is the soul of our mission. She did not work *for* the people of the Amazon; she lived *with* them – learning their language, partaking their food, healing their wounds, and above all, winning their hearts. Her mission flowed from her communion with Christ and with the people she served.

2. Community towards Communion

At the root of Missionary zeal is the community that prays together, dreams together, and suffers together. When our relationships are marked by kindness, forgiveness, and openness, our community becomes a living witness of God's love, the sacrament of communion.

The spirit of the Preventive System, as the article underlines, is enshrined in the conviction that every relationship is an opportunity for grace. Every Sister who listens with empathy, every educator who encourages a struggling student, every parent who collaborates with trust - all participate in the saving mission of Christ. In such a community, the Gospel is not merely taught; it is *touched* and *experienced - it is lived!*

We are not called to be perfect, but to be **authentically present**, willing to let our lives become transparent channels of God's mercy. A divided community weakens the mission; united, it multiplies daily miracles.

3. The Sanctity of Communion

We begin November, a month that reminds us of the **Communion of Saints**, a reminder also that our mission does not end here and now, nor does it end with ourselves. We are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses - early missionaries and countless Sisters who had lived their vocation with unassuming fidelity.

When we celebrate our local communities, we celebrate the miniature "communions of saints" - imperfect yet grace-filled, human yet holy. With every smile, every shared responsibility, every act of service, we add a new melody to the hymn of holiness. Let us remember that holiness is not reserved for heroes in history books; it is hidden in the local communities, in the classrooms, in the refectory, in the office, and in the playground - our mission enables us to discover that in the daily communion we live.

4. Mission: Sent to our Communities

The month of November calls our attention to *renew the fire of love that sends us forth*. We are sent to the ends of the world, it is true. But first and foremost, let us remember we are sent to our communities. A true missionary is one who is set aflame by the love of God and carries that flame of love into every relationship, every encounter and every initiative for the good of the other.

Our educating communities become "abodes of love," where every young person feels welcome and every educator feels empowered, where everyone feels part of one family. When the world sees how we love each other, they will believe in the love of Christ that we proclaim.

Following the example of St. Maria Troncatti, may our educating communities bring healing where there is hurt, peace where there is dispute and love where there is violence. May we be missionaries not just out in the world, but in our communities, promoting communion wherever we live and with whomever we work.

As we thank God for the gift of the newly canonized St. Maria Troncatti, let us remember with gratitude, every missionary Sister who continues her legacy; let us make our own educating communities, truly missionary at heart. In the spirit of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello, may our educating communities continue to form hearts in communion, burning with faith, joy, and service - until every corner of our world is aflame with the love of God.

ALL SAINTS DAY: (November 01) All Saints' Day invites us to rejoice in the great cloud of witnesses who have lived the Gospel fully. They were not perfect, but they allowed God's grace to shape their weakness into holiness. Their lives remind us that sanctity is not an exception but a daily call, to love generously, forgive readily, and serve joyfully in the ordinariness of community life.

ALL SOULS DAY: (November 02) On All Souls' Day, we pause to remember with affection our beloved departed sisters, family members, and benefactors who now rest in God's peace. As we pray for them, we renew our hope in the resurrection and the communion that unites heaven and earth. Our remembrance becomes a practice of gratitude and fidelity, inspiring us to live meaningfully each day, aware that our life too will one day be a gift offered back to God. May this day rekindle in us the desire to walk humbly with the Lord, transforming our daily duties into moments of grace, and our relationships into pathways of holiness.

CHILDREN'S DAY: (November 14) Children's Day in India reminds us of the sacred gifts that children are to the society. Our Christian conviction affirms that each child reflects the beauty and goodness of the Creator, carrying within them dreams, energy, and a pure heart that draws us to experience more deeply the simplicity of Jesus' Gospel. As educators and caregivers, may we mirror God's tenderness through our patience, presence, and joyful service. Let this day renew in us the Salesian spirit of love for the young, and inspire us to learn from them the art of wonder, trust, and joy that keeps our hearts youthful and our mission alive.

IX WORLD DAY OF THE POOR (November 16): The Message of the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, for the 9th World Day of the Poor, is: "You are my hope" (Ps 71:5)." Celebrated this year on 16 November 2025, the day calls us to place our hope fully in God, who never abandons us, even in times of difficulty or loss. The Holy Father reminds us that the greatest misery for persons is living a life without God; and that true richness is found in faith, love, and charity. We are invited not only to assist the poor but to walk alongside them, listening, learning, and sharing in their lives. Helping the poor is not just an act of generosity but a duty of justice and love, which allows our communities to become signs of hope. In this Jubilee Year, may we embrace this call, making our lives, our ministries, and our institutions channels of God's mercy, compassion, and hope for all.

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING: (November 23) On the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, reminding us that Jesus is the Lord of heaven and earth. This feast was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to remind the world that Christ's power is greater than any worldly power. In a world today divided by selfishness and pride, Jesus shows us a different kind of kingship, one of love, truth, humility, and service. From His throne on the Cross, Christ reigns with mercy and justice, calling us to let His love rule our hearts, families, and communities.

THE ARRIVAL OF THE PIONEERS: (November 24) On November 24, we joyfully recall the 103rd anniversary of the arrival of our FMA Pioneers in Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu. Six young and faith-filled Sisters, moved by ardent love for God and zeal for souls, courageously embraced the unknown to bring the Salesian spirit to this land. Their humble beginnings marked the dawn of our mission in India, which has now blossomed into seven vibrant provinces, radiating the light of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello. As we gratefully remember their legacy, let us draw inspiration from their missionary courage and fidelity, responding to the needs of our times with compassion, creativity, and hope. May the Lord who guided our pioneers continue to bless our provinces with holiness, unity, and new vocations, that the flame of the Salesian charism may keep burning brightly for generations to come. In this connection, let us immediately speak of a great anniversary that awaits us...

II YEAR PREPARATION FOR THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FMA'S MISSIONARY EXPEDITION: The Institute of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians has begun the joyful celebration of the 150th anniversary of our first missionary expedition of 14 November 1877. Guided by the inspiring motto "It is time to rekindle the fire!"- a vibrant reminder

from Mother Mazzarello - we renew our missionary fervor and spiritual enthusiasm. This three-year preparation, inaugurated on 14 November 2024 by Mother Chiara Cazzuola, leads us into Year II (2025 - 2026) as “*Pilgrims of Hope*”, in harmony with the grace-filled Jubilee Year of the Church. Having completed our Triennial Verifications, we walk forward with renewed zeal, uniting also with the Salesian Family in the celebrations of their first missionary expedition, ready to rekindle the fire of our charism for today’s world.

MAMMA MARGARET: (November 25) On November 25, we remember the Venerable of God, Margaret Occhiena, the mother of St. John Bosco, whose life was marked by faith, humility, and selfless service. As a widow, she raised her children in the love of God and became an indispensable support for her son’s mission of caring for the poor and marginalized youth. Known as “Mamma Margaret,” she was an integral part of Don Bosco’s mission in Turin, transforming the oratory into a family and caring for the boys with motherly love and parental discipline. While we recognise the inspiration that she is, to serve others with love, sacrifice, and service, we resolve to pray fervently that her sanctity be recognised by the Holy Church for the edification of all.

ADVENT - 2025: The main theme for Catholic Advent in 2025 is “*Pilgrims of Hope*”, in harmony with the Jubilee Year 2025. Each of the four Advent weeks - *hope, peace, joy, and love* - will take on a deeper meaning as they connect to this call to walk as hopeful disciples in our world. Advent 2025 invites us to pause, watch, and prepare our hearts for the coming of the Lord. In a world longing for light and peace, we journey with trust, opening our lives to God’s presence and welcoming Christ who makes all things new. May this holy season lead us to grow in prayer, gratitude, and charity, so that, like Mary, we may carry Christ to others and become true signs of hope and joy.

POPE LEO XIV, FIRST APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION “DILEXI TE”: Pope Leo XIV, in his first Apostolic Exhortation *Dilexi te* (“I have loved you” - Rev 3:9), reminds us that faith cannot be separated from love for the poor. Echoing Pope Francis’ invitation for all Christians to recognize the deep link between Christ’s love and His call to serve the poor, the document urges believers to see Christ Himself in the faces of the suffering and marginalized. Spanning five chapters and 121 paragraphs, “*Dilexi te*” presents love of Christ as lived through concrete acts, caring for the sick, opposing slavery, defending women from exclusion and violence, promoting education for all, welcoming migrants, fostering equality, and practicing charity. Flowing directly from the Gospel, it reaffirms the Church’s long tradition of social teaching as a rich treasure that continues to guide Christians in living the compassion of Christ in today’s world.

DRAWING NEW MAPS OF HOPE, THE LATEST APOSTOLIC LETTER FROM POPE LEO XIV: On 28 October 2025, the Holy Father released the Apostolic Letter titled, “Drawing new maps of Hope,” to mark the sixtieth anniversary of the declaration of the Second Vatican Council “*Gravissimum Educationis*”. In it, Pope Leo XIV reaffirms and expands that document’s vision, applying it to the challenges of the present time. Citing examples, which include Don Bosco and our favourite preventive system, the Pope encourages renewal in educational environments through empathy and openness, insisting that education must form the whole person, integrating knowledge with the heart and the capacity for discernment. Catholic schools and universities are to be places where inquiry is guided and supported, not suppressed. Teaching, he adds, is to be understood as a vocation of service that offers time, trust, competence, and compassion, joining justice with mercy. It would do a lot of good for us to read and reflect deeply on this letter, as persons who have received our call to be educators.

- **CANONIZATION OF SR. MARIA TRONCATTI:** We thank God with joyful hearts for the gift of a new Saint to our Salesian Family - St. Maria Troncatti, Daughter of Mary Help of Christians, missionary, and artisan of peace. On October 19, 2025, in St. Peter's Square, Rome, Pope Leo canonized seven new Saints during a solemn Eucharistic celebration, among them our beloved Sister Maria Troncatti, the first FMA to be elevated to sainthood after our Co-Foundress, St. Mary Domenica Mazzarello. The celebration gathered more than 70,000 faithful, with the Salesian Family, recognizable by their radiant joy, banners, and youthful enthusiasm, filling the square with color and gratitude. In his homily, the Holy Father praised the new Saints as "witnesses of faith and missionaries of hope," and highlighted Sr. Maria as a courageous evangelizer "at the forefront in defending the dignity and rights of the local inhabitants and of women." Coinciding beautifully with World Mission Sunday, the canonization became a hymn of thanksgiving for all who dedicate their lives to spreading the Gospel of peace and reconciliation. With hearts full of gratitude and renewed missionary ardor, we joyfully acclaim: St. Maria Troncatti - Mother, Missionary, and Artisan of Peace - pray for us!
- **XAVIER BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN INDIA - XXV TRIENNIAL CONFERENCE 2025:** Sr. Masilamani Sebasti Jeya Pushpam and Sr. Vedamuthu Savariammal participated in the XXV Triennial Conference 2025 of the Xavier Board of Higher Education in India, held at St. Aloysius (Deemed to be University), Mangaluru, from 18 to 21 October 2025.
