Provincial Circular

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My dear Sisters,

Cordial greetings and prayerful wishes from Tiruchirappalli.

A New Year comes with a gamut of promises of grace. As we step into 2026, I wish to assure each of you my heartfelt wishes for a year filled with hope, and God's gentle companionship. These first days of January naturally turn our hearts towards the Lord with gratitude, for the gift of life that we have, that of our vocation that gives us a sense of purpose, that of the community that surrounds us, and that of the mission that keeps us anchored in meaning. I promise my loving prayers for each of you and for every community of our Province, that the months ahead may unfold with peace, joy, and renewed zeal for our shared mission.

New Beginnings and the Journey of Growth (Cons. Art. 70)

January invites us to begin again; it is not wiping our slates clean, but entering anew with a deeper awareness of God's steady fidelity that had accompanied us all through the past year. With God on our side, nothing ever can be in vain... every effort, every struggle, every small act of goodness becomes a seed for growth. As we embark on this new year, we are reminded that the first renewal needs to be, not in our schedules or activities, but in the meaning and spirit with which we live our mission. We turn to Article 70 of our Constitutions which focuses on Catechesis as our fundamental mandate.

Rooted in the Heart of the Mission

Article 70 places before us a simple yet profound truth, that the heart of evangelisation is the proclamation of Christ - not programmes or plans, not projects or performances, but the person of Christ who is living, loving, and present in and through us. The beginning of a new year invites us to pause and gently examine how much Christ continues to be the first voice the young hear in us and through us, when we speak, or even before we speak! Does our presence, our tone, our community life, radiate a warmth that stirs the faith in them? These are considerations that take us back to the question of who we are.

Our mission is never merely an activity; it is a relationship - our relationship with Christ who commissions us and with the young to whom we are sent. It is within this relationship that everything else finds its rightful place. When it weakens, even the most spirited activities lose their depth. The New Year is therefore a graced moment to realign our hearts, making our mission the heartbeat of our lives.

Catechesis that Touches Lives

The article we reflect on this month, reminds us of the task of catechesis: fostering growth in faith and helping integrate it into life and culture. This is not simply about teaching something but about accompanying lives. In our own contexts, where the young live in a world that is fast, digital, and often fragmented, catechesis needs to be warm, meaningful, and connected to real experiences. The young do not seek rehearsed answers from us, nor following of traditions blindly; they long for sincere voices and lives that gently whisper, “God makes our lives meaningful.”

Catechesis becomes transformative when it speaks to the heart, when it is woven with compassion, when it addresses real struggles and dreams, and when it helps the young discover that faith is not an idea to grasp, or a data to memorise but a shoulder to lean on, the shoulder of a person called God. It becomes evangelisation that flows from our sense of hope, honesty, and prayer.

Communities that Carry Christ

The article reminds us that our communities are called to create environments of faith. This atmosphere is often formed not through grand gestures but through the small, consistent choices we make each day. Our communities become evangelising when kindness becomes their natural tone, when forgiveness flows without delay, when prayer shapes the day, and when joy finds its space even amidst routine tasks and ordinary concerns.

The young people encounter Christ not first through our words or works but through the climate our communities radiate. When a young person steps into our presence and feels recognised, secure and valued, evangelisation already begins. We could consider it an invitation that the new year comes with: to reflect on the “climate of faith” that we have managed to create in our communities. What do the young get to feel when they are around us? The cue is, before any formal catechesis begins, the community in itself becomes the first catechesis, and the first catechist.

Growing in Faith, Growing with Faith

January naturally turns our attention to beginnings, as we already have underscored. Article 70 is also a reminder that, our task is not only to accompany the faith-journey of the young but also to nourish our own. We cannot guide others into the depth of faith if our own roots are dry. A whole new year - that is a splendid offer that each of us is given with, a loving invitation to return to the Word of God with renewed love, to allow silence to soften our inner tensions, to let the Eucharist deepen our sense of mission, and to remain open to being evangelised by the sincerity and freshness of the young.

Faith grows through small, steady, intentional steps. It grows when we allow the Lord to speak to us in the ordinariness of our days. It grows when we cherish moments of prayer not as a duty but as a space where God shapes our inner world. And finally, it grows when we recognise that every day offers us a hidden grace to behold.

Doing Our Utmost with Humility and Hope

The article concludes with a phrase that is both gentle and strong: “*Let every Daughter of Mary Help of Christians do her utmost...*” - this is not some perfectionistic demand nor a burden of some unrealistic expectation! It is simply a call for us to give our best, to give our

100%, our honest, humble, wholehearted best, in whatever we are involved in, wherever we are! That is a total collaboration with the Grace that calls us. God blesses not the extraordinary but the sincere; God does not ask us to do the impossible, but just the ordinary with utmost love.

My dear sisters, as we venture into this New Year, let this invitation fill our minds, free us from any undue pressure and help us focus not on what we cannot do, but on what we can take upon ourselves with fidelity, generosity, and inner freedom.

We shall entrust this year to our loving God who walks with us and who waits for us. May our communities become places where young people encounter a faith that is alive, attractive, and accessible. Not just our words, may our gestures, attitudes, and our very selves present Christ with genuine love and sincere care. Let us step into 2026 with confidence, certain that every new beginning unfolds under the gaze of our Lord who guides, guards, and gently grooms us. Let us begin this new journey of 365 days, as women of faith, women of hope, and women consecrated in the name of the Lord for the salvation of the young.

59TH WORLD DAY OF PEACE 2026: For the 59th World Day of Peace, Pope Leo XIV calls the attention of the Universal Church to the Easter greeting of the Risen Christ: **“Peace Be With You All: A Call to an Unarmed and Disarming Peace.”** *“Peace be with you!”* - is unarmed and disarming, born of God’s unconditional love and capable of transforming hearts, relationships, and history. In a world increasingly marked by fear, violence, arms race, technological warfare, and the erosion of trust, this peace rejects the logic of deterrence and domination. Rooted in the Gospel, it shines amid darkness, resists evil without becoming violent, and reminds humanity that true security is founded not on weapons, but on justice, dialogue, and mutual trust.

The Holy Father calls all people, especially believers, to begin with the **disarmament of hearts, minds, words, and attitudes**, so that peace may be lived, protected, and radiated. Peace is not merely a slogan or distant ideal, but a daily journey expressed through nonviolence, mercy, responsible dialogue, ethical leadership, and care for the most fragile. Religions are urged to purify their language and witness, firmly rejecting any misuse of authority to justify violence or manipulation. As pilgrims of hope in this Jubilee time, we were invited to build communities as true “houses of peace,” offering prophetic witness to goodness that disarms, hope that endures, and the peace of the Risen Christ that can shape a more humane future.

STRENNA 2026: For 2026, the Rector Major of the Salesians of Don Bosco, Fr. Fabio Attard, has presented us with the Strenna **“Do whatever He tells you - Believers, free to serve,”** inviting the Salesian Family to deepen a journey of faith rooted in attentive listening, trust, and discernment, inspired by Mary’s words at Cana (Jn 2:5). Building on the Jubilee experience of hope, the theme affirms that true hope flows from faith, as witnessed in Don Bosco’s life - a faith that reads the signs of the times, courageously welcomes God’s will, and commits generously to the good of the young. The Strenna highlights a vital dynamic in which faith gives birth to freedom and freedom flows into joyful service, uniting prayer and action, Word and life. In the context of the **150th anniversary of the foundation of the Association of Salesian Cooperators**, the Salesian Family is renewed in Don Bosco’s dream of a shared mission and called to bold, responsible, and generous service, especially

in favour of those who lack the “wine” of hope, in faithful response to Mary, the woman of new wine!

UNO THEME 2026: For 2026, the United Nations Organisation has highlighted three vital and interconnected priorities, announcing this year as the **International Year of Volunteers for Sustainable Development**, recognizing the millions of volunteers whose service strengthens communities, advances the Sustainable Development Goals, and fosters resilience through education, health, environmental protection, and emergency response; **International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists**, drawing attention to the vast rangeland ecosystems that cover nearly half of the Earth’s land surface and to pastoralist communities whose lifestyle supports biodiversity, food security, cultural heritage, and climate resilience, calling for greater recognition, inclusive policies, and sustainable investment; and **International Year of the Woman Farmer**, celebrating the indispensable yet often overlooked role of women across agri-food systems, promoting gender equity, access to resources, leadership, and innovation. Together, these priorities offer a global orientation to value unseen contributions, strengthen sustainable livelihoods, and encourage collective action towards a more just and sustainable world.

FEAST OF ST. DEVASAHAYAM: (January 14) We celebrate this month our beloved Saint Devasahayam, India’s first canonized lay martyr, who stands out as a powerful witness of faith rooted in courage and conviction. Inspired by him, who after encountering Christ, chose to live the Gospel with integrity, embracing suffering with patience, forgiveness, and total trust in God, we recognise that true discipleship demands fidelity even amid opposition. May he inspire us to remain steadfast in faith and to witness Christ through our words and actions each day.

BLESSED LUIGI VARIARA: (January 15) Blessed Luigi Variara, a Salesian Priest with the spirit of Don Bosco, radiated compassion, hope, and courage. Amid suffering and social exclusion, he founded the Congregation of the Daughters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, opening paths of dignity and consecrated life for those considered ‘forgotten’. His life reminds us that true holiness is born of charity, creative fidelity, and trust in God’s loving plan, especially for the most vulnerable.

THE UNITY OCTAVE 2024: (January 18-25) The Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity (DPCU) has released the materials for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2026, observed from 18-25 January. Inspired by Ephesians 4:4, the theme calls Christians to live as one body, one Spirit, and one hope. Prepared with the Armenian Apostolic Church and other ecumenical partners, the prayers draw from ancient Armenian traditions and invite believers to renew the prayer of Jesus: “that all may be one” (Jn 17:21). It is an opportunity for deepening unity through prayer, conversion of heart, dialogue, and shared witness as signs of reconciliation and hope in today’s divided world.

BLESSED LAURA VICUÑA: (January 22) Blessed Laura Vicuña (1891-1904), the young Chilean girl who faced family hardships, exile, and abuse after her father's death, rooted herself in profound faith while she lived with the Salesian Sisters in Argentina. At just 12 years, she offered her life to God for her mother's conversion from a sinful relationship,

enduring illness and violence with heroic purity and love. She died on January 22, whispering her sacrifice, which soon led to her mother's repentance. Beatified in 1988, Laura shines as an inspiration today, especially for youth and abuse victims among them, to trust in God's grace, choose holiness amid suffering, and offer selfless love that can transform hearts. May our beloved Blessed Laura Vicuña, pray for us!

ST. FRANCIS DE SALES: (January 24) Saint Francis de Sales (1567-1622), the beloved “Saint of Gentleness” and Doctor of the Church, the patron of the Salesians of Don Bosco and the entire religious family initiated by Saint John Bosco, is admired for his gentle kindness, apostolic zeal, and optimistic spirituality! This is the reason Don Bosco chose him as model and protector to inspire the pastoral approach of winning hearts through love rather than force (“more flies with honey than vinegar”). He imitated Francis's meekness in educating youth, dedicating his first oratory and the congregation to him, and drawing from works like *Introduction to the Devout Life* to establish that holiness is for everyone. Additionally, Francis is patron of Catholic writers, journalists, the deaf (for teaching *via* sign language), and others. His legacy of patient evangelization continues to inspire gentle faith amid challenges. May Saint Francis de Sales, pray for us and continue to inspire us!

REPUBLIC DAY: (January 26) India's 77th Republic Day on 26 January 2026 celebrates the Constitution of India, which declares the nation to be a sovereign, socialist secular democratic republic, founded on the ideals of justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity. This Constitution which was adopted in the Indian parliament on 26 November 1949, came into effect on 26 January 1950 which was celebrated for the first time as Republic Day of India. Let us honour this day with great patriotic fervour, cherishing India's unity in diversity, rich cultural heritage, and national strength. On this occasion, let us pray for our nation, that peace, harmony, and justice may prevail, and pledge our commitment to protecting and preserving the values enshrined in the Constitution, leading to the common growth of all.

FEAST OF DON BOSCO: (January 31) We await this month the joyous Feast of **Saint John Bosco**, our Father and Founder, whom we remember with gratitude for his life of faith, love, and tireless dedication to the young, especially those most in need. - **ANIMATORS' MEET:** The Animators' Meet was held on 13 and 14 December 2025 at St. Francis Xavier Convent, Broadway, Chennai. On 13 December, a one-day Leadership Training Program was organized for the animators of our communities, facilitated by Mr. Nathan N eville Philip, Chief Learning Officer, SedSap Learning. Rooted in Gospel values, the training focused on strengthening community relationships, effective communication, conflict resolution, building community morale, and servant leadership, aiming to foster unity, harmony, and a culture of communion in our communities through reflective exercises, dialogue, and practical situations from religious life.
